A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

I'm not *that* type of person who finds himself inclined to be consumed with celebrity culture, nor the happenings with those of fame. If my distaste for that nonsense hasn't been firmly established thus far, let it be now! With that, though, I did find myself drawn into the ceremony of the Queen's funeral rites this week. Again, celebrity culture is one of the dumbest things that we people engage with, and foreign royal culture is on that same par of stupid. But Elizabeth always seemed to be somebody that understood that herself. I really think that aspect of her is strongly correlated to the world's fascination with her. In a lot of ways, she was someone known the world over, yet never really capitalized on that. It was remarked often in various pieces I read over the last few weeks that the public never knew a single political view she held. She never talked about them. Since 1952, all the world events and the seismic changes within her own Commonwealth, she rarely – if ever – publicly commented on them. All we ever heard from her were words of faith and duty to the Church and Commonwealth. There is something remarkably beautiful about that, which I feel, the world sensed and imbibed freely on over the decades. Living in a constant crisis-generating world where a celeb has an opinion on everything and living within a society where people exploit every ounce of influence they can, you had a woman who had everything and could've affected anything, who merely wanted to serve and be a reminder of the purity of a life well lived.

Anyway, enough Queen commentating! There's been enough of that! (I was watching some Sky News and BBC over the last few days to see 'Commonwealth coverage', and they had people on who, like, gave her Corgis a doggie biscuit back in 1973 telling what it means to have lost the queen – it was rather hilarious how many people they could find to talk!) I did wake up to watch her funeral Monday AM and, surprisingly, I was pleased I did! Firstly, what struck me so strongly about the entire funeral liturgy was how little it was about her, and how immensely it was about her faith in Christ and her Hope in the Resurrection! How many funerals of government leaders or famous people have we seen over the years that were about the person, a docket of eulogies with a hymn sprinkled in here or there? There was hardly a single thing about Elizabeth, but everything to do with her Faith. Yes, I get it, she headed a Church, but there is a difference between heading something and believing something. Regardless, though, the world watched a purely Christian funeral that was all about God! Certainly, that witness will have planted some seeds of awe about her faith in some people's hearts over the globe. It was a real evangelistic moment, not just because it was a beautiful Christian rite, but because you knew it wasn't just procedural, this faith was thoroughly hers! Brilliant and beautiful! To repeat the above point, even in death, she wanted the ritual to remain about the Church, not her. Even if future monarchs simply mimic her funeral arrangements, I'm not entirely sure you'd get the same evangelistic emphasis and power that hers had. Not casting judgment, but I simply don't get that same genuineness from His Majesty. I'm not his subject (thank you, Washington, Madison, Jefferson, et al.!), so my opinion really doesn't matter!

Secondly, Britain may not be an overly, nor overtly, Christian nation anymore, but they are certainly religious! Not religious in the sense of giving their lives to the Church, but religious as in being a people of great ritual and ceremony at great expense and sacrifice. It was simply remarkable to see the hours upon hours of ritual they went through for their queen; while *none* of it was necessary, *all* of it was necessary! This is what iconoclasts and those who hate the beautiful things of religion fail to understand: when you are serving something (the monarchy) or someone (God) greater than yourselves, ordinariness and pragmatism have no place. Could they have simply tossed her coffin into the back of a Ford Econovan and driven her to the backdoor of Windsor to carry her into her vault? Of course! I mean, she still gets interred and with far less expense and world distraction. But when you serve something (or someone) greater than yourself, you wouldn't imagine acting as crassly as that! You engage in rituals and traditions that are often centuries old or millennia ancient because they draw you out of the world and the ordinariness and heartbreaking nature of it so that you can get a glimpse of something otherworldly, other-natured. I could not unglue my tired, early morning, eyes from my MacBook watching for something like two hours thousands of soldiers of innumerable ranks, branches, and offices walk through the streets with the remains of their deceased monarch to her castle for one last time. I certainly couldn't take my eyes off the stunning image of those roughly 150 Royal Navy officers pulling her coffin. That was so unnecessary, yet it was so incredibly necessary! The world was given the sweet and delicious taste of the most vibrant and unabashed display of religious ritual that I think it's seen ever on that scale. I say religious, because that really is what it was, a secular religion – the religion of the British Monarchy and remnants of the British Empire. It is beautiful, and it serves to give us a great lesson in how we are all truly wired for religion and ritual. Those who dismiss it are denying their humanity and the divine spark within them! I just pray that the display of secular ritual and secular religion we saw with Elizabeth's funeral marches, rites, and ceremonies – as well as the beautifully simple yet fully Christian Funeral Liturgy– serves to remind the world that we need religion; we need ritual; we need to unabashedly do great, grand, and beautiful things for God, not just Her Majesty and the scant remnants of an empire!
