A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

Happy New Year! No, not that kind, but the liturgical kind! With this Sunday, we embark on our new Liturgical Year that will see us through, primarily, the Gospel of Mark with a significant selection of John's Gospel sprinkled throughout. This is the year, for instance, where we will contemplate, for five weeks this summer, John's *Bread of Life Discourse* in John 6. With Mark being the shortest of the Gospels, the Church gives us a selection from John's Gospel to add to the Sunday cycle. For those that may forget, the Church Years are divided into a three-year Sunday cycle: Year A, B, and C. Year A, which we just finished, was primarily devoted to Saint Matthew's Gospel, Year B, Saint Mark, and Year C, Saint Luke. Saint John, the Beloved Disciple, does not get his own year, rather, he is read heavily in the Easter Season and within Year B, alongside Saint Mark. The Weekday Cycle has a different philosophy than the Sunday Cycles. There are two years for the weekday lectionary readings: Year 1 and 2. The weekday cycle's primary goal is to get us reading as much of the Bible as possible. There is less of an obvious structure and game plan as the Sundays have, as the weekdays are there to expose us as much as possible to a liturgical reading of the Scriptures.

All together, the three year Sunday Cycle and the two year Weekday cycle allows the faithful to liturgically hear 13.5% of the Old Testament (excluding the Psalms) and 71.5% of the New Testament! In my opinion, the greatest fruit of the Second Vatican Council was a rediscovery and falling back in love with the Word of God! The Lectionary we have, for all its quirks like mercilessly chopping up passages and omitting some key lines, is a witness to the world that the Church is serious about the Word of God. If you scratch your head at that, look at the numbers from before the Council. Previously, the amount of Scripture in the Lectionary was abysmal and embarrassing. Before the Council, The Old Testament was not read on Sundays, but only certain seasons and feasts. So, pre-council, the Church read just shy of 1% of the OT (excluding the Psalms), compared to our 13.5% now. For the New Testament, even though the Church primarily read from it exclusively pre-council, She only managed to get in 16.5% of the New Testament, compared to our 71.5%! For all the opining and romanticizing that often happens within Catholic circles about going back to 'how things used to be', I don't ever want to go back to a time where we were only given a liturgical reading and contemplation of just 5% of the Bible as compared to today's 30%! I have said it before, but I believe the Church - and the world - are on the precipice of and in need of a revival of Biblical Proportions rooted in the Word of God. We read the Word, Worship the Word, and we eat the Word! Let us carry our hunger for The Word into this new Liturgical Year and make it our resolution to delve deeper into it this year. There are just so many ways, routes, avenues, apps, tools, studies, books, youtube channels, pedagogies, and programs to go deeper - just do something that works for you so that you may bear new fruit this coming year with The Word. Following the words of last week's Gospel, when did we see you thirsty and give you water to drink, hungry and give you some food, naked and clothe you, imprisoned and visited you, let the Word of God make us more sensitive and aware of the needs of the citizens of The Kingdom and love them and serve them because of our love, for not only God and His Church, but also His Word.

Now that we are in the Season of Advent - the shortest possible Advent we could have - let us be on guard to not waste it nor procrastinate in seizing the Grace of these very few short and fast days. One thing you could commit to is a daily devotional rooted in The Word. I have available for all of you this weekend a daily devotional from Magnificat and Little Books. Both are great little daily devotionals to get the heart and mind properly situated within the context of Advent for that day. Please take them and use them for your own spiritual fruit this Season.
