<u>A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON</u>

About three years ago, I decided to turn off the television, cancel cable, and just live in a tv-less world. Now, I am not some curmudgeon; I love Love LOVE to watch a good story! I can get so incredibly pulled into a good character or plot that it just consumes my mind to the point where I have even rewritten characters or plots of shows if they just didn't sit well with me or, yes, even shed a tear if it moved me so! When someone asks what my favorite tv show, movie, book, play, artist, song, musical, opera, or whatever is, it is so hard to decide because I am just someone that falls in love with any title or character by any artist in any genre that is well crafted and performed. I consume a ton of movies, series, music, and art – just on my own terms and when I want to consume them. To know me is to know my love of all these things and how seriously I take them and how important good art is to me - from Rachmaninoff to NF and Jay-Z, from Hitchcock to Flanagan and Tarantino, from Dostoevsky and Dickens to Rowling, from Monet to Banksy! One of the items high on my bucket list (If I kept such a list) is to hear my all-time favorite classical piece of music, Gustav Holst's The Planets, in Royal Albert Hall in London because that is the location of one of my favorite movie scenes of all time in The Man Who Knew Too Much. Okay, I'll calm down! I could write Russian novel-length tomes about these things (Russian novels, did I mention I can't put down Dostoevsky?!)! Anyway, I said I pulled the plug on mindless television, flipping through channels, and just finding something to draw away the evening. I was finding I was doing that too much and it was a massive virus on my productivity, my prayer, and my overall wellbeing. Now, some can handle tv and not let themselves become unhealthy, I can't. Anything that invites mindlessness and laziness is something I need to fight against with gladiatorial determination! Not because I like being lazy, but because I know how easy it is for me to lose time and energy on things that mean nothing. So, I haven't flipped through a television channel in over three years, and it has brought about a reality of freedom like nothing has ever before! Freeing because I am not hostage to the enemy that brings on laziness and wasted time. Freeing because I can, without guilt or regret, spend leisure time consuming all the mediums of art I love and only what I love! I'll subscribe to Netflix for a month and binge a show I really feel will be a treat to watch and then cancel right away. Whenever I find a new show on there, or on Hulu or whatever else, I'll simply subscribe and then unsubscribe whenever I'm done. It not only is a great way to not nickel and dime myself, but also it better keeps me in control and assures I don't consume junk, just the beautiful and deep things I desire. Again, all this helps me overcome one of my weaknesses - the propensity to fall into wasting time on things that really mean nothing in the end – and contributes to a greater sense of freedom and enjoyment in the things I do watch in terms of movies and shows/series. This little practice and discipline has also allowed me to find far more time for reading, prayer, hobbies, and one of my favorite things to do in the world: at night, sitting in the dark house, playing music too loud for hours! I have a Bose radio where if you play the right song, it will make the paint flake off the walls! I love it! Ok, I digress yet again! I capture this facet of myself because it is what comes to mind when I read the Gospel for this weekend. Our Lord is speaking to the dangers of loving money to the point where the love for money abducts your ability to love God and those in your life. I know, it's a Christian trope that has become almost a dreaded cliché at this point - the Church will condemn the love of money until they need your money! Trust me, I hate and loathe it, too! Putting aside the cringe and lame way many pastors handle the money issue, I see something deeper whenever our Lord warns against the love of money, especially here in this weekend's Gospel. Yes, we all know that hoarding and not being generous is sinful, it's bad, but it's more than just not being bad. What Our Lord is getting at is more about the enemy's desire to capture us and take away our agency, our freedom that we were created to have and live by. If we lose our agency to choose to do with the wealth, time, life, and relationships God gave us to care for and be stewards of, then we are deputizing the enemy as the steward of what is God's! Be it money, our time, our relationships, or television habits, if we surrender our freedom, we can't live the life a Christian is called to live. Period. In terms of so many things in life, it is less about the quantity (amount of dollars, hours of television, number of friends, etc.) and more about whether are we free – and allowing ourselves to be free - to live a holy and virtuous life. That life doesn't have to be boring or dull, it can be crazy exciting and full of fun and awesome and beautiful art and music and stories, and people and experiences. We need to simply be aware though that the enemy wants to spoil and poison all this - that is his victory, don't let him win! Life is beautiful and is meant to be beautiful, but it cannot be if we are not good and holy – let us assure ourselves the freedom we need to make this life what God desires it to be: holy and free here and welcomed to freely run into the Father's House when this pilgrimage is over.


