A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

One of the ways I spend a significant amount of my time in prayer is by creating in my mind's eye what I feel Heaven will one day be like. Perhaps it's a useless and foolish pursuit, and there are indeed many spiritual traditions that would caution greatly against that: if the mind is fallen, then it can't be trusted to reveal such revelations. Maybe. I lack the wherewithal to know if what I think of is anywhere near reliable, but I can't but help allow imagery to enter my deepest and intimate prayer with The Lord, and the Father. With the images that come to me in prayer, some are intensely personal and unique to me – burgeoning out of specific experiences of prayer or knowledge I have come to have of Christ or the Father. One, though, that simply comes from what I find beautiful, and 'spirit-inducing' is the season of Advent. Yes, in a lot of ways, Heaven, to me, is like an eternal Advent with everything that comes with it! Darkness, fridity of the air, slowing down of creation, a sense of expectation, magnified joy and sense of meaning, and a time where we naturally are drawn to those that we love. Everything about Advent is what I want heaven, at the very least, to offer and be all about! If I could find someplace on earth that was nearly always both dark and frigid, we'd be having a moving party for me – I do not like to be in sunshine and warmth – I really don't! I feel most alive and hope-filled when it's dark, grey, blowing snow, and all you can really do is hunker down indoors. I feel most melancholic when Spring begins to wield its ugly sunshine on the earth! So, once Advent comes around, not only are the liturgical and spiritual elements most dear to my heart – and what I desire to feel in Heaven – but also the shortening of our days and lengthening of our nights that take place in this season as we barrel into the belly of winter. I wish some element of darkness and chill to cloak my heavenly experience! I also desire that a sense of longing and expectation for Jesus that never leaves also punctuates my heaven, for I never want to not desire Him.

That longing and desire for the Lord are what makes this holy season so unique and palpable. A temptation that we need to resist with Advent is that it never becomes just four short weeks to either prepare for Christmas (getting our shopping done or cookies made) or to think about past events and people (Bethlehem, mangers, and wise men). Advent has a wholly and entirely unique gift it wishes to offer us, and we as Catholics need to resist those other distractions to the point where they don't replace or body-check the beautiful offerings of this season. This will be my focus and efforts this Advent – both for me and you. Please take advantage of the daily missals/devotionals I have for you this weekend. Some daily prayer and meditation outside of the ordinary are incredibly helpful to draw every bit and piece of what Advent has to offer you. There are nearly 30 man-hours of Confessions offered in Advent here in the parish – not to mention the Penance services throughout the deanery. Get rid of all gunk and lies from your soul! As you feel the desire for Christ in this season, also feel His desire for you! Let Him draw you into Himself by eradicating all the sludge and grime of life from your soul through the powerful moment of Absolution. If you can do anything else that draws you out of routine and distraction – reading the various Infancy Narratives in the Gospels, visiting those alone over these weeks, assuring that those without will have a beautiful and meaningful Christmas, writing letters and cards to shut-ins or those serving overseas who will be away from loved ones – anything! Let the Lord guide your heart to what you ought to do but do something to honor the beauty of your desire for God and His desire for you so that Advent can be all that it needs to be for you in your life and soul.

Take note that after all weekend Masses, until the drawing on Feb 4, we will be selling chances for the side-by-side / \$20,000 raffle after weekend Masses. This is a huge opportunity for you to win a remarkable prize and to supply some needed funding to the school. If you would like to take tickets to sell to friends or family over the holidays, too, we can supply you with some to take and sell. I already needed to draw from savings at the beginning of the school year, but I do not want to dip anymore, so I ask that you do whatever you can to support this raffle. Also, we will have SCRIP available for sale after weekend masses throughout Advent that you can use for both holiday shopping and gifts. SCRIP is a mammoth way to earn money for the school and parish, and one that I want to better utilize as time goes on. For now, though, for those who do not understand it, you purchase gift cards at face value, but the school gets a percentage of that cost. For instance, Sheetz offers 3%. If you buy a \$25 Sheetz gift card, you pay \$25 and you get a \$25 Sheetz gift card. Easy and done. But, on the other end of that transaction, Sheetz lets St Michael's keep 3% of that sale, or \$0.75. That may not sound like a ton but think about if 100 people decided to use SCRIP to buy their gas all year. $\$0.75 \times 100 \text{ people} \times 52 \text{ weeks} = \$3,900$. For merely 100 people deciding to use Sheetz to buy \$25 of gas a week, the school profits nearly four grand! That's just that simple example – there are hundreds of merchants! Again, I really want us to begin to become a parish that supports this and introduces a game changer into our funding of the school! For now, though, please know that it is available all Advent for your Christmas shopping and gift-giving.

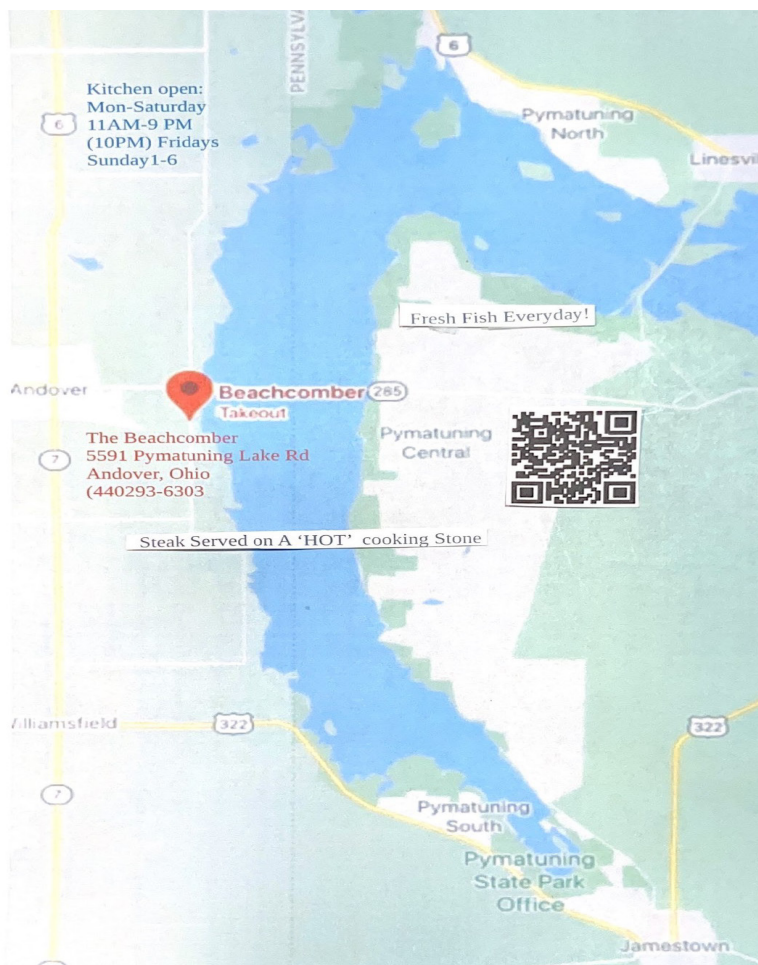
