<u>A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON</u>

Now that I've got a solid two weeks under my belt, it's beginning to feel less like I'm just filling in for the pastor of St. Michael, and more like I am actually the pastor! I know the letter from the bishop says that; I know I moved here because of that; and I know I've told you I am the pastor, but it's just felt so surreal, and I was having a hard time transitioning into feeling it if that makes sense. I can certainly say that I have plunged head and heart first into the rhythm and dynamics of this beautiful and vibrant parish, and you have done nothing but make me feel at home. I still need to plan my formal Installation as Pastor with the bishop, so that will be forthcoming, hopefully soon, once that can get scheduled. I appreciate your understanding with some tuning of the weekday Mass schedule. I know it is great to have Mass available at the parish each day of the week, but I will be honest with you, I really need my time home seeing family and simply relaxing. Some pastors choose not to take their day off, but Canon Law grants the priest the availability to care for themselves by being away each week. If you will grant me the pardon of going home weekly to Erie, then I promise I will labor ardently for you the other six days of the week! This is a parish with much happening, so I need that weekly recharge to assure I can serve you well. Something I failed to mention in my introduction letter was that I also am in the midst of a training program in Spiritual Direction through the Institute for Priestly Formation. Those sessions are held three times a year, for a week, out at Mundelein Seminary, just north of Chicago. I have a week out there in October, February, and May over the course of the next two years. I've already completed a little over a year. Depending on a couple of variables, including travel arrangements, I may need to miss a part of, or an entire, weekend those weeks, but I'll give you plenty of notice. I've both driven and flown out there twice now; I'm still figuring out my October plans - there are a few other variables I need to take into consideration. My 2012 F-150 can make it an expensive drive - especially with these prices – so we'll see, but airlines, too, are absurd for such a quick flight... decisions, decisions! The nature of the training is Spiritual Direction in the tradition of Saint Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuit Order. Ignatius' story is remarkable, and his turning outward from himself to the living God inspires me and gives so much context to his method and spirituality of spiritual direction. Essentially, Ignatius believed that each person, in being created by God is wired for and assumed to have a deep connection and knowledge of God and knows the tone and sound of His voice! I am here and available to anyone that would like to do spiritual direction, who would like to talk about anything regarding their spiritual lives -

- please do not hesitate to reach out to me. As your pastor, I am first and foremost the Spiritual Father of Saint Michael Parish, and what kind of father would I be if I didn't help my spiritual sons and daughters know the voice of their Heavenly Father, and of His Son, Jesus Christ? Please, anything I can offer you in terms of listening to you and hearing about the struggles of your spiritual life, but also its richness and unique beauty, please know I always have time for you. Speaking of prayer, the Gospel this weekend contains our Lord teaching His disciples to pray. What He gives them are a few simple sentences. This prayer, The Our Father, is simple in its brevity, but enormously profound in what it asks of and seeks from The Father. This pillar of Christian prayer should never be taken for granted, dismissed as insignificant, and just rambled through, but we should look at it and treat it as the treasure that it is. When Our Lord was asked how to pray, this is what He gave us! Think about that! The Incarnate God of the universe teaches us in the words of the Gospel these few lines as the means to pray. Let's not overcomplicate prayer or keep trying to reinvent it - the Lord gave us the model, let's contemplate the beauty and depth of this.






