A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

Following up on last week, I wanted to give you a simple snapshot of the first quarter of the church's fiscal year. Susan and I sat down and went through all the numbers on the last day of the quarter, September 30, and analyzed the numbers to get a good picture.

A few notes: 1) Operating Income, as I use the phrase, is all money that comes in that is not restricted. It is money we can use to operate the parish, 2) St Mike's has not designated the excess CSA funds to a specific project, other than care of the buildings, so those funds from CSA that are coming in above and beyond the assessment are helping significantly to operate the parish's buildings, 3) Other Income is money from candles, faith formation fees, unrestricted gifts, etc., 4) the largest expenditure, outside of salaries and benefits, is our subsidy to the school, amounting to just under \$13,000 a month. Here is the Q1 Report.

As you can see, we finished Q1 with \$9,693 more brought in than spent. This is nice going into the next quarter, especially as heating bills begin to kick in. One point of comparison, last year at this point, the Offertory was at \$129K, so that is down slightly, but considering how much more money we all had a year ago before inflation began to really wield its ugly self, it's understandable and not bad. We are in a good place! Thank you for your generosity!

The opening line of the Gospel this weekend shows us where we are in the terms of the life of Jesus. Saint Luke opens this passage by writing the descriptive line, "as Jesus continued His journey to Jerusalem...". The point of this journey to Jerusalem isn't to visit some friends nor to sightsee and go to a nice restaurant. The point of this journey – a journey that has been the context for the last several weeks of Gospel passages – is to go endure and execute His Passion. We are in the latter part of the Gospel of Saint Luke, and Our Lord is on His way to go have the Last Supper, endure the betrayal and arrest, show trial, and go to Calvary to die. This Gospel Passages this time of year are always taken from the latter pages of the Gospels and contain the waning days of Our Lord's earthly and public ministry as He heads towards Jerusalem. This is yet another reason why this time of year – the non-liturgical season of October and most of November – is my favorite! That backdrop and context of what Our Lord is going through, thinking about, preparing for, and psyching Himself up for gives the words and actions of these Gospel passages depth and meaning beyond just the surface words and actions. This is the reason why I have been so in love with the Letters to Timothy over the last several weeks. (You have probably been thinking to yourself, "doesn't father have anything else to talk about; does he not have anything else original to contribute?" Well, the answer is no! I don't really have much!)

When I am reading the Scriptures, what I so want to understand is what were these people thinking, feeling, seeing, smelling, and tasting – what are the *whys* behind their words and actions? When I approach the Scriptures, I don't want to just know what was said or done, but *why* it was said or done. This 'why' is the doorway to uncovering, for me at least, the great Beauty and Truth just pining to be discovered in the Holy text! As we journey through the texts of Scripture over our years here together, join me in seeking the why behind the actions and words, and never being simply satisfied with flat and hollow summaries, but deep and piercing revelations of God!

Note – Tuesday's 8 PM confession this week will need to be canceled as I will be coming back from an out-of-town commitment.


