A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

The Diocese is right now finding itself in the midst of a new phase of Pastoral Planning for the parishes of the Diocese. (If interested, there is website speaking about it: <https://www.eriecd.org/planning.html>) The first wave of planning took place 2017 resulted in a reduction in the number of parishes from 116 to its current 93 parishes with 127 church buildings. There are many numbers and stats to present as to understand why the Diocese is undergoing another round of planning, but I will present two here for this article.

The first is Sunday Mass attendance. In 1990, the average attendance throughout the 13 county Diocese stood at 120,000. In 2012, it stood at 52,113. This past year, October 2022, it was 26,770. That is a loss of half in the last decade and a 78% decline in the last 32 years. In 1990, there were 127 parishes; today, there are 93. We have lost 78% of attendants but only 25% of parishes.

The second figure is the number of priests serving in our Diocese. Back in 1990, there were 210 active priests ministering in the 127 parishes. This is the reason so many parishes were blessed with more than a single pastor, and the idea of one priest overseeing multiple parishes was nearly non-existent. The current number of active priests in the Diocese of Erie sits at 92 who cover – among other ministries -the 93 parishes (120+ church buildings). To me, the most sobering of numbers is that in 2031 – eight years from now – we are projected to only have 60 active priests...! To reiterate, today, we have 93 parishes and 92 priests; in eight years, that number will be 60 priests who cannot serve 93 parishes.

I could talk about this in book form, I have so many thoughts and ideas that I would love to share over time, but for now, here are just a few observations. Firstly, Saint Michael Parish is going nowhere anytime soon, other than to continue to grow into the flagship of what a parish in the Catholic Church is meant to be! I'm not giving you hyperbole or a pep talk, I am just giving you my honest observation, and you know I am not afraid to give you my opinion! I did not give up my life and say Yes to Christ to facilitate a purging of souls from the Church or to be hopeless in the face of daunting numbers and looming realities! I may be an outlier, but numbers like this don't scare me; they excite me! Not excited because I love to see less people living the active life of faith within the Church. No, that saddens me and tempts my humanity to want to blame certain trends and ideologies and sins and personalities that seem to have usurped Christ for decades in the Church. I won't gripe or hurl insults at people or trends – what is done is done and we are here living with the fruit of their nonsense. (That 78% decline in Mass attendance is not exclusive to death, birthrates, and moving out of the area. Many were just simply fed up with the absurdity and nonsense of so many things, not the least being scandals and ugly liturgies). Regardless of the past, we are here with a slew of numbers, stats, and data that can intimidate, but I see it as there are tens-of-thousands of souls in our 13 country Diocese that are hungry, crying out for the living God and we can satisfy their souls! We are in a missionary age, an age where our Christendom is not something that is just matter of fact, but rather a treasure the world is in poverty of, and we can enrich the world – enrich souls, Sons and Daughters of the Father – through our missionary activity!

As a kid and through seminary, I had a whole spectrum of ways in which I envisioned myself living out the priesthood. The most prominent image, for me, was as a contemplative. For many years, I prayed hard that God would call me to be a Carthusian who lived in the silence and solitude of his cell for the remainder of my life. I truly did. But it was not my will that would win out, it was the Will of the Father who I, wholly believe in every cell of my nature, heard calling me to serve the Diocese in this age and with these beautiful opportunities to bring souls to Him through an active life in parishes. At the core of my priestly heart and soul is this tension for craving the cell of solitude, but knowing I am called to be in the Aeropagus like Paul bringing souls to Him through active ministry and joyful engagement. Do not fall into despair at numbers, get excited by them and understand your vocation because of them! And pray, encourage, talk to, and refer young men to the priesthood! I wholly believe that God is raising up a new generation of missionaries for his Church who will not administer a dismal demise, but usher in a new wave of the Spirit and live lives as joyful missionaries in this land!

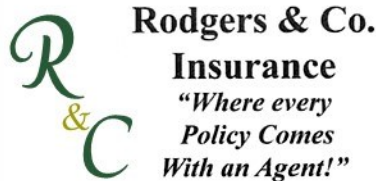
