A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

A huge Thank You to the entire crew who helped plan, cook, set up, tear down, and volunteered in various capacities for last weekend's Parish Picnic! In all my years of going to parish picnics as a kid and in through my priesthood, I've not been to one as perfect as ours last week! There was an enormous amount of food; the tent, tables, and chairs were comfortable; the conversation and friendship among all of us were fulfilling (the name tags were great, too – I think I committed a few more names to memory! I am so terrible at names, so please don't stop telling them to me – it's not condescending, it's truly helpful). In my short six weeks or so here, I have come to realize that this is a vibrant and on-fire parish! If we can pull off a picnic that was that seamless and positive of an experience, then imagine what is capable in all we do! I am so grateful The Lord has called me to be here among you as your pastor; each week brings a new experience that really drives that home. Our Gospel this Sunday is one of those which can carry with it much baggage, especially in an age where either so little is seen as absolute, or where so few are willing to commit to the full truth of faith and what God has revealed to us. Our Lord is posed with the question, "will only a few be saved?". Perhaps there is no greater question than that in life; perhaps there is nothing more consequential than the reply to that interrogation. Isn't all we do here in some way supposed to influence the outcome of our salvation; isn't the sacrifices we endure and put upon ourselves supposed to reap some benefit? That is certainly what the early followers of Jesus were trying to uncover when this believer asked Our Lord the age-old question. It was not just in Our Lord's day that this was a curiosity among His followers - it remains paramount to this day. Then Our Lord doesn't really give him an answer in the same direct tone, rather, Our Lord gives him a parable. You can almost see the crowd rolling their eyes or sighing because they probably thought here is a question that He surely can't evade, and yet He gives them a parable and has left it to the Church to preach. But what does He really say and what does it mean for us? Well, because we have been praying through this response for two millennia, my little paragraph here will not satisfy. What I do want to zero in on here, though, is the fact that asking that question is not where we want to start or operate from. As I said above, we are inundated and barraged by a worldview and society that undermines any scent of objective truth or reality. We also live in a very loud world where billions of voices are magnified, and each is trying to outshout the other - our society operates at a disastrous level of decibels. All of these, and other factors, contribute to us simply wanting, or pining, for just a simple answer, "give me the facts; tell me what's real; I just want to know what I've got to do! That is the need the world has right now and it is what the Church needs to offer! The Church cannot be another cog in the machine, another lemming walking us off a cliff. The Church needs to be the source of the answers to those salvific questions whose consequence has

no earthly match! But this is where many, I think, get frustrated with faith, the Church, with God - we do not just offer pithy platitudes to assuage anxiety, nor do we reduce God and what God is capable of doing and has done to a mere "do this not that". The answer to the question of who will be saved is not one that can be answered that way. Our Lord doesn't answer it that way, and neither should we. How does He answer it? He tells this curious mind who is inquiring that it is not for the world to see, know, or judge. The only one who knows who will be saved is God Himself – more specifically, the Father who sees all and knows all is the one who will receive those saved into His home. "But just tell us what to do already"! Well, we can't be shouting Lord, Lord, look at me! Look at what I do; look at what I've accomplished; look at how wonderful I am and how bad they are! This is what that person was looking for - and truth be told, it's what we are often looking for - but salvation is not a balance of good deeds over bad. Salvation is for the one who knows the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! This is something unmeasurable in a way we may want it measured. Our Salvation is a fruit, an outflowing, of our relationship with The Holy Trinity, the Holy Mother of God, The angels and Seraphim and Cherubim, the saints in the Heavenly court and the home of the Father. Salvation is derived from our participation in things not of this world. That is why St Dismas could be in the presence of God - he was being executed for crimes and sins beside Our Lord on Calvary, yet because he yearned for an eternity with God, God welcomed him into it. To the world, Dismas was damned, but to his Heavenly Father, he was a child who came home. Who is saved, and how can we be saved? Stop asking that, and desire to be with God and make your life supernatural here and now so it may continue into eternity in the presence of all that is celestial and beautiful.
