A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

A topic of broad topic of interest of mine that I enjoy reading about or hearing lectures or podcasts or YouTube videos about is the topic of how America has changed since September 11, 2001. I think because I was a high schooler at the time, it was something that was very real, and I was old enough to experience the stepping into a new America, a new world, in those months and years that followed. I would suspect that 99.99% who are reading this just get and understand what that means - I don't have to justify it or paint a picture of examples. This happened in so many ways, and looking at those trends that started that day - many of them we still live with today - is just something that is historically fascinating, and as someone who loves his country, helps to better understand Her today, as well.

One of the many strands of cultural, political, financial, spiritual, emotional change that emerged that day was the rise of what's been coined, New Atheism.

The New Atheists was a name given to a growing list of people who held a celebrity like status because they aggressively fought against the idea of the existence of a God. Names like Christopher Hitchens, Richard Dawkins, Sam Harris, and Daniel Dennett are among the most popular. Those four in particular were known as the 4 Horsemen of New Atheism. What is New Atheism? Essentially, these writers and lecturers advocated for an *intolerance* towards the supernatural, religion, the immaterial world, etc. That is to say that new atheism was aggressively against any notion of God, and to extinguish the idea of God was the proper role of society. You might ask how that is different from 'pre 9/11 atheists'. Well, the difference lies in that in a pre 9/11 world, generally speaking, the atheism movement (if you want to call it that) wasn't out to *extinguish* people's faith or their freedom to talk about God. It was an academic pursuit, rather, of intellectuals to see whose arguments for or against God were superior. In the daily life of the world, it was just a worldview or value system - just not believing in God, and you moved on with your day and largely didn't care if you interacted or worked with people who did. Now, with New Atheism, the mission was to intellectually *arm* the masses to go to *war* to fight and *kill* God. There was a heightened aggression towards anything that smelled of the supernatural because, well, from that movement's perspective, the supernatural will lead you to flying planes into buildings. There was an equivocation made of radicalized terrorists in cockpits of planes with grandmas in church pews. And, so, there was a movement to snuff out this God that both terrorist and grandma loved and worshiped.

It's fascinating because, firstly, it's frustratingly absurd! But what is also fascinating about it... or maybe I should say, *was* fascinating, was its lifecycle. By all accounts from others who observe and commentate on these religious-intellectual movements and trends, this New Atheism Movement is all but dead. These individuals that spurred this movement have largely fallen out of grace from the masses, and their arguments have just been found banal and tiring. They've been debunked and the holes of their arguments illuminated just too many times. But, besides the academic failure of it, the movement didn't really *feed* anyone. Hordes of *faithful* New Atheists just abandoned the movement because it amounted to really nothing but a bunch of grifters feeding on their emotions and legitimate hunger for Truth. You know what hasn't gone away, though? God! The Truth has remained here and triumphant. Now, those people who were devotees are still out there and they are still hungry, but the majority have just fallen into a hopeless apathy - despair that Truth and ultimate meaning and purpose are not out there. *This* is where the Church needs to breach walls and storm into minds and hearts. This is why I always advocate for learning and contemplating the depths and riches of our Faith because people are so hungry for that wealth of Truth. Our Gospel today is a great icon for those former adherents and those who just simply never committed to anything of the supernatural or of faith. They are just standing around waiting for Christ - you and I - to come and save them and give them their usual daily wage - Truth! May we keep showing up, with the Beauty and Goodness of Truth to all languished hearts and minds and give them their usual daily wage!

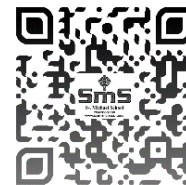
