A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

This Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter, is a rare celebration within the American Church. Only Dioceses in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Maine, Massachusetts, Vermont, Nebraska, and Pennsylvania celebrate Ascension on Thursday (of this past week). Everywhere else in the United States, the Solemnity is transferred to this Sunday, and thus they do not celebrate a 7th Sunday of Easter. Why is this? Well, it comes down to the authority of the bishops of each 'region' to determine their Holy Days of Obligation. We are part of what is called Region III, which is composed of the Dioceses of New Jersey and Pennsylvania, and this Region has decided to keep Ascension on a Thursday, therefore keeping it's Holy Day status and preserving the 7th Sunday of Easter. If you found yourself in Miami, for instance, this past Thursday you would have not been able to get to an Ascension Mass, nor were you obligated to. You are obligated to observe local law, so since it wasn't a Holy Day in Miami, you were free to stay on the beach! I'm not sure if it's true or not, but I've heard it said that the Diocese of Rome celebrates it on Sunday, while the Vatican celebrates it on Thursday! So, you could stand with one foot in Rome and another in the Vatican, and be subject to both...or neither law! I don't know how that works!

It is a shame that most American Catholics do not celebrate this Sunday because it is the only Sunday of the Church year where we read from John 17, Our Lord's High Priestly Prayer. This Gospel is broken up into three parts and read over the course of the three Liturgical Years: A, B, & C. This is the longest prayer of Our Lord recorded in the pages of Scripture, as well as, I feel, the most intimate and personal of all His recorded words. This prayer, amid the Last Supper Discourse, is directed to His Father, and expresses, in delicate detail, The Son's Love for both His Father and the Apostles – His friends. This prayer reveals to us a nature of prayer that we all need to interiorize and make our own: prayer cannot be mere recitation, but personally conversive and intimately attentive. The desires Our Lord's Heart are raw, real, and open in the lines of this prayer; the text is almost dripping with tears. The immensity of His Passion is upon Him, the weight of the cross already beginning to weigh down His sacred body. Under that weight, though, and the blend of emotion threshing through His veins, the words of this prayer is His lasting testimony and glimpse into what we are to become. We are to become both people of loving relationships & Beloved Sons & Daughters of our Heavenly Father. Neither of these are accomplished through mere recitation of memorized lines, nor through the intellectual ascent of a set of ideas. This is only accomplished through encountering a person, an event, which gives life a whole new direction and purpose. This person is Christ who shows us the Father and who sends us the Advocate. If we are not in love and falling in love, we are not Christians, rather we have Christian ideas we ascent to. The High Priestly Prayer of Christ, we see, is a template for our life of prayer. Prayer can contain recitation of words, like the Divine Mercy Chaplet, but if that is the only prayer we engage in, we are just devotional, we're not prayerful. There is a subtle, yet profound, change that occurs in the heart of someone who leaves the exclusivity of devotional prayer and immerses themselves in the Divine Intimacy of something wholly their own! Let this prayer be for you a model and an invitation for exposing the deepest yearnings and desires of your heart before the glory of God! Devotions are fundamental to our Catholic spiritual experience, but they do not and cannot take the place of true relational and contemplative prayer. It's not about one or the other, it's about relationship which we can experience in devotional prayers but are not replacements for contemplative relational prayer.

If you haven't planned to, I recommend that you plan to come to the next two weeks of our conversation on Pope Benedict's Encyclical *Deus Caritas Est*, God is Love. I think it is a foundational and game changing contribution to the faith of the individual who seeks and desires that contemplative and intimate posture of prayer. Wednesday morning at 10 or Thursday evening at 7, for the next two weeks, come and let's chat about Love!

I want to also highlight that Wednesday evening at 6PM, there will be an all-hands-on deck brainstorming meeting in Lateran Hall to discuss how we can work together to freshen it up before next school year. The hall is getting tired inside and our students deserve to eat and play in a fresher environment. Without doing a total reno or going crazy, we simply want to see what resources we can pull together and help we have so we can get it looking better by next year.
