A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

Next Sunday, I will be heading back up to Chicago (Mundelein, IL in the Northern suburbs) for another week of instruction towards this certification in Ignatian Spiritual Direction. I will take the 4:30 Saturday & 7:00 Sunday, Fr Ray will take the 9:00 & 11:00 as well as cover for the week. Leaving after the 7:00 worked out nice the last time I went up in February. I got there in perfect time and didn't feel rushed or anything. For this time around, I will just duplicate that plan from earlier this year. After next week, I will only have a 10-day retreat in October (I will need to miss 1.5 weekends for that) and then a final week of instruction in January. After that, I just need to plan to do at some point in time the 30-Day retreat I had talked about previously. Doing that retreat is a dream of mine right now – I will need to see if it is possible to make that happen. Either way, that, though, is my schedule of events as I finish my final year of this program. It will be sad to end it in January; I have come to enjoy the time I spend with my brother priests from all over the country, and Canada. They are all in love and on fire for the priesthood and the spiritual life – it is a great atmosphere to be in and camaraderie to have. I will cherish the days I have left in the program over the next several months. As always, I am grateful for Fr Ray's help!

I wanted to give a thank you to all those who have so quickly brought us to the precipice of our CSA goal! I've been told that we have not been this far so quickly in recent memory – thank you! Over the next few weeks, I will be putting together the budget for next year as that is due 31 May. The incredible progress of CSA has taken out a lot of the guess work that traditionally is put into that budgeting process. I am excited to make the new parish and school budgets with all these new plans and ideas I've talked about and see them laid out in the various line items. I really believe we are in the advent of a new era for the parish – school, church, and cemetery! I appreciate your responsiveness to the CSA and every need that comes our way! You really do make my stewardship of all three entities under my care a whole lot easier! If you haven't pledged yet for CSA, but would like to, you have time for that. Remember, it doesn't need to be offered all up front. The drive goes through the end of the year, so giving a little here or there throughout the rest of the year is totally ok – it's what I do. Again, thank you to all who pledged to, not only satisfy the Diocesan assessment, but to give financial help to the school and faith formation, as well as getting some roof repair done (after those windstorms we had a few weeks back, we lost quite a few shingles, so that work will be happening asap).

Saint Peter, this weekend, offers the first converts Baptism after hearing his words and expressing a desire for more, for God. There, Peter Baptizes three thousand of them, and they all receive the Holy Spirit and become the first Christian community – the first parish we could say! We see later in Acts, as we noted a few weeks back, that this first parish supported one another and cared for each other. They were primarily refugees in the city and yearned to have their whole lives and identities transformed and transfixed onto Christ! There was such a hunger for Christ and for souls; they wanted all to know of the quenching waters of Baptism and the nourishment of the altar. Together, they grew in faith, loved each other, opened the Word, shared in the celebration of the nascent liturgies of the Church, and ceaselessly preached Christ to every soul with an ear to listen! At the end of the day, this is a parish, this is where the rubber meets the road in the life of the Church. The Church remains just an abstract concept or word without parishes and communities living it. A vibrant and mystical body as that first Acts parish...that is where the word *church* takes on contours and texture that give eternal meaning to our lives and identities as Beloved Sons and Daughters. I've said elsewhere that I take the pages of Acts as my personal manual of how to pastor and build a parish community that becomes a touchstone of God in our community. A parish of Biblical proportions, as we see in Acts, is not one that is always trying to reinvent the wheel or to be smarter than God or by constantly trying to be relevant (don't get me started; lucky for you, I'm running out of room!), but one that hungers for and feasts upon the Word & Body of Christ! Once filled, that parish then goes out and fills others with that same Word and Body so that we don't just grow in numbers, but that Our Father may win over more of His Beloved Children...that is our mission and goal! As we continue these days of Easter, let us continue to contemplate the beauty and divine brilliance of this Book of Acts and see it as a gift from The Father for how we would serve Him to bring all His children home!
