



#### A WORD FROM FR. BRANDON

You will find with your bulletin this weekend a calendar for the month of Dec that includes all the available times for the Sacrament of Penance here at Saint Michael, the date and location of the various Penance services in the deanery, as well as the Christmas Mass schedule. Please keep this calendar handy throughout the season of Advent. I thank Fr Ray for helping minister to us by taking Mondays and helping on Saturdays with confessions. It was my practice in my previous parish to load up on confession availability and spend the season in the confessional – I love doing that! Advent is a time of Penance because we are preparing our souls and our bodies to be fully engaged and immersed in the Mystery of the Incarnation that we'll celebrate in a few weeks at Christmas. The enemy desires for us to think of Advent and Christmas as just a few weeks where we think of a past event and sing popular carols around a tree. He loathes the reality that the God he rebelled against has come to save and redeem us, not the enemy! Let us rub it in his face even more by not just approaching these upcoming holy seasons with reverence and awe, but also with souls cleaned of his polluted nonsense and lies! Let a clean soul be a way you splurge on yourself this holiday season - luckily, it's always on sale!

Next weekend I will have available to all that would like, two different daily devotionals to use throughout the season of Advent. I purchased for all of you Magnificat's Advent Companion and the Little Blue Book put out by the diocese of Saginaw, MI. Both are great little books with daily readings, prayers, and reflections. I'll have them available in purple envelopes in the gathering space for you to pick up and use throughout the upcoming weeks. I chose those two because they are both great and present the daily devotion in unique ways from the other, so however you want to pray, and however certain prayers and readings speak to you, there is something in them for everyone.

This week is Thanksgiving, and I pray that for each of you it is a day of great meaning and love. I will be home from Wednesday to Saturday with my family. We will be having dinner with my dad on Wednesday evening, and my mom Thursday. I love this time of year so much, and I really do look forward to spending these days with my family and having some great food together! I really hope that all of you have or find people that you love, and who love you, to spend this week, and the coming weeks together with. Family and Friends, love and relationships, are what these weeks are all about – both in the secular holidays as well as the liturgical feasts and seasons we commemorate. With my being home, and Fr Ray being away with his family, we will not have Mass on either Thursday or Friday this week.

This weekend we find ourselves on the final Sunday of this Liturgical Year: Christ, the King of the Universe. This is my favorite Sunday of all the Sundays that we celebrate each year! Interestingly, though, I really don't pray to Christ as King too often – my relationship with Him has moved to other aspects and details, so that His kingship, honestly, plays little role. Early on, sometime in seminary when my prayer and liturgical life began to take on some significant shape and meaning, the image and title of King spoke deeply to me, and it was honestly a comfortable and familiar place to enter into a relationship with Christ and begin gaining knowledge of Him. As time has gone on, though, I have entered dialog with Him through that regal title far less often. Despite that, this Sunday maintains itself as the heavyweight champion of my favorite Sundays because it reminds me of those days when the title played a far greater role in my life – it tethers me to the greater reality that my relationship with the Son of the Father has grown and matured over the years, and this solemnity reminds me that! It gives me hope and encouragement to continue going to Christ, knowing that as times and seasons change, he will always be there for me and never leave me in the same place. As someone who wrestles to maintain that hope at all times, Christ the King gently speaks to my heart, my soul, that He will never leave or abandon me.

Christ the King is a title, but it is also a recognition of His rule over Heaven and Earth, a rule that is not to be challenged or replaced by anyone or anything in our lives. Yes, we all struggle to maintain this kingship of Christ in our lives – we call that sin! – but, what this solemnity reminds us is that though we may choose a golden calf or a politician or an ideology over Christ, His choice and desire for us never sway or wavers. We don't have to hope that He loves us, protects us, leads us, or gives up His life for us. We are the ones who falter, not Him. We are the ones who chase after something new and shiny all the time, wrestling to keep our hearts and minds squarely on Him and His love for us. We fail. We sin. He does not. As we celebrate Christ the King and close out this Liturgical year and prep ourselves for the holy season of Advent, let us acknowledge the golden calves in our hearts, minds, and lives, and pray that we find the courage this Advent to discard them and hurl them into the fiery furnace of the Mercy of our King, Lord, and Love!
