A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

This weekend, the last of the Liturgical Year, is my favorite Sunday of each year. No, it's not just because it is the week before my favorite season, Advent, but rather because it hits on an aspect of reality that I find most compelling for the faith we profess and strive each day to give our lives to.

To me, Christ the King is the Solemnity that sums up all that we do and battle for in the world. For all of us, we are born with a nature that has inherited the consequence of Adam. As you are well aware, you and I live in a world and in a fleshly nature that is crippled with a propensity towards sin and a failure to give honor to the Image of God you and I were created in. The cumulative time we spend battling this fallenness, examining our fallenness, asking pardon from God and others for our fallenness is pretty insane if you sit back and think about it! Then, if you put the battles of our physical nature aside, and look at the spiritual battles we endure, it, too, is insane. Think about the amount of time you spend thinking of where God is when you need Him, why He let ABC happen, how do I pray and is He even listening to me, and then let's not even mention all the thoughts and temptations that ravenously reign in our thoughts and memories. Think about how much of our lives are consumed with variations of those realities and struggles - it's disheartening to really take an account of that in our lives. Then, on top of all that, you think about the role disease and illness, broken families and relationships, and grief and loss hold in our lives. Let's not, also, forget the ravages of war, poverty, hunger, thirst, injustice, greed, manipulation, and sheer human tragedy that pervades every corner and crevice of our world and politics. To say it yet again, it's just insane and sobering to really think about how pervasive the sin of Adam has been in the daily existence of every soul - religious or not. There is no escape of this sin of Adam here in this life. Even the most acerbic of atheists engaging in the most debauched life with an absolute apathy towards anyone - a man entirely untethered to anything of the spiritual or supernatural - will ultimately be taken down and obliterated by Adam's sin. It's not a religious vs non-religious conversation or reality - it's simply how we live and find ourselves. The great lie of the world - this same world so soggy with sin - is that we need to liberate ourselves from punitive and archaic religion so that we may be free, and experience the bliss and heights of human pleasure and achievement. Many have left, are leaving, and will leave their home, the Church, for the pursuit of that lie. Why? Not because of the evidenced results, but rather, they are trying to escape Adam and The Fall, and 'the world' seems to be offering a way out. The truth is, sadly, that they, too, will realize the annihilation that awaits those who flee from the only source and power that can offer us true freedom: Christ, The King of the Universe!

What I love so much about this Solemnity is that we are not only conjuring images of Christ with a crown of gold on his head and a scepter in his hand while seated upon a priceless throne. More importantly, we are celebrating the King that will and can and has offered us a true freedom from Adam's sin and has invited us to live in a Kingdom where the sin has no welcome! You and I are loved by this King; you and I were so desired that this King came off his throne, threw aside his crown and scepter, and went to the depths of Hell to battle for us Himself - He was both King and Warrior! Throughout our lives, we not only give honor to this King, but unlike any other King, He also offers therapy for our wounds inflicted in this earthly kingdom. He gives us His love, His touch, His Grace, His Mercy, His very Body and Blood to consume so that we may know of what awaits us if we never flee this King. May you and I not live in a regal fear of the King, rather run to the King and fall in love with our King! That is His vocation, mission, and desire - let's enjoy the fruit and the freedoms offered by Him!
