A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

This is our final full week of Lent, and next week we will enter Holy Week where we will experience the eternal nature of Our Lord's Paschal Mystery. Next week will be a partial week of Lent, beginning with the reading of The Lord's Passion on Palm Sunday and it will end at the beginning of the Lord's Supper, where we'll enter the Sacred Paschal Triduum. Until we get there, though, we have a full week of Lent this week. Capture and obtain all the Graces you can this week as we prepare for the celebration of Our Lord's battle for our souls! Perhaps you could spend the week in prayer, contemplating how in need you are of being rescued by Him or perhaps your desire to be loved more securely by Him. Whatever it is that speaks most to you or what you are most in need of, let this final full week be a week filled with holy desire and Paschal preparation!

Please make note of the Triduum Liturgy times for Holy Thursday (7:00 PM), Good Friday (3:00 PM) and Holy Saturday / Easter Vigil (8:30 PM). These are the holiest days of our year as Catholics and every effort should be made on our part to partake of these liturgies. This is the moment you and I breach time and space and enter into the cosmic celebration of Our Lord winning us back! They are not 'Holy Days of Obligation', per se, but to prefer to sit at home and watch the news or Law and Order reruns instead of coming to worship Our Lord who saves us... I don't know. For those who have participated in these liturgies, you know they are like none other and not 'simple Masses'. Indeed, The Triduum is a three-day long Liturgy - Holy Thursday begins as usual but has no conclusion; Good Friday has no beginning nor end; Easter Vigil has no beginning, but finally a final blessing that concludes the Liturgy that began days earlier on Holy Thursday! To experience that flow and rhythm of all three days is a sacred treat that you just will not find duplicated elsewhere or at any other time. Please, if you want to be intentional about your liturgical and spiritual life - and really become that somebody we have been meditating on throughout Lent - then the Triduum is truly that desert, that Mount of Transfiguration, that time when The Temple is filled with uncreated Easter Light! The Triduum, see you there next week!

This week will be our last fish dinner before we go into quietness of Holy Week. I'll be able to share numbers after this week with how much we sold and what we brought in. For now, though, I must say that I have never been part of a parish fundraiser that seemed and felt less about the income and more about the community and camaraderie as this Lenten Dinner we put on! There are so many of us that come each week to cook, serve, clean, set tables, prep desserts, take orders, and handle money. It is remarkable to see so many of us eagerly come together for, not the task but opportunity, to serve a great meal to the community and to give many a chance to just come together and be together. This is only my third parish in my time as a priest, but there is such a unique character and 'flavor' to this community – of both churches (remember, one parish, two churches). In an age of so much parish restructuring and change and closure and merger, there is still so much life and vitality here, and in a rare way! It is my hope that we can continue to work together, grow together, pray together, worship together, and fall in love with the Son who shows us The Father together! There are only a few days of Lent remaining, please make every effort to get to Confession and to The Sacred Triduum, and while you're at it, get some fish!
