FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

“The rulers sneered ... the soldiers jeered ... one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus.” Is this the King of the Jews, the King of the Universe? If it is so, perhaps his kingdom is not at all what we would expect! In his letter to the laity, St. John Paul II spoke about how Christians share in the kingly mission of Christ. First, *“they exercise their kingship as Christians, above all in the spiritual combat in which they seek to overcome in themselves the kingdom of sin.”* In other words, before we give any thought to transforming society, we must first allow God to transform us. Through daily prayer, regular self-examination, and frequent confession, we can recognize our faults more readily and choose love instead!

Second, St. John Paul II writes that the laity *“make[s] a gift of themselves so as to serve, in justice and in charity, Jesus who is himself present in all his brothers and sisters, above all in the very least.”* Christ’s kingship, and our own participation in it, requires us to look beyond the privileged of society. It goes beyond networking and struggles of power. It goes with Jesus to the Cross!

Still, the kingship of Christ ought to effect society. *“The lay faithful are called to restore to creation all its original value ... ordering creation to the authentic well-being of humanity.”* Jesus does this in a radical way through his death and resurrection. We, too, are invited to bring new life to the world around us. This means holding the world and everything in it as sacred. It means advocating for civil policies that respect life and paying special care to the vulnerable and marginalized in every stage of life. It means being disciples of Jesus, inviting people into authentic love so that one day we will together *“be with [him] in Paradise!”*

Sacrament of Baptism: Sacramental preparation is required of the parents who desire to share the Catholic faith with their children and are held monthly throughout the City of Erie. Godparents must be Confirmed and practicing Catholics with a letter of recommendation from their pastor to serve as a sacramental sponsor.

Religious Education, First Holy Communion, and First Reconciliation programs are hosted at Saint Luke’s Church for all eastside Erie parishes. Contact their parish office for more information and to register your child (814.825.7105).

Confirmation preparation for all eastside Erie parishes is hosted at Saint John’s Church. Contact their parish office for more information and to register your child (814.454.2873).

Sacrament of Holy Orders: God calls all people to holiness. Some men are called to fulfill this vocation as priests. If you are interested in the priesthood, or have questions about it, please contact a parish priest or our Diocesan Vocation Director, Fr. Michael Polenik, at 1.800.374.3723.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Before a date can be scheduled, a priest must be contacted at least six months in advance to complete the required documents.

Sacrament of the Sick: Communal celebrations of Anointing the Sick are scheduled periodically. The sacrament can also be requested by any parishioner who is seriously ill or in danger of death. *Please note:* Federal law no longer permits hospitals or nursing homes to contact churches when a parishioner is admitted. It is important that family members to notify the parish office if a loved one needs a visit, desires to receive Holy Communion, or needs Anointed.

Leave A Legacy: Consider Saint Stanislaus and Holy Trinity as you meet with your attorney or financial planner regarding your estate planning. Remember the needs of your parish family and leave a legacy of faith for future generations with your generous remembrance.

Bulletin Information Deadline: Please submit information to be included in the weekend bulletin by noon the Monday prior. Holiday bulletin announcements must be received by the parish office two weeks in advance.

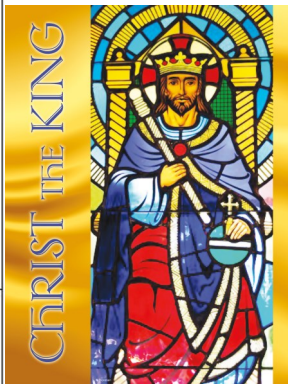

SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Real power doesn't grab or push

2 Samuel 5:1-3; Colossians 1:12-20; Luke 23:35-43
"Are you not the Christ? Save yourselves and us."

The bluster of schoolyard bullies isn't much different from the threatening words of the world's tyrants. Only the reach of their destruction sets the tyrants apart. Among the revelatory transfigurations of Jesus is how he deftly transforms divine authority into the surrendering action of a servant. While worldly powers seize and hold, Jesus shares, teaches, and heals. As bullies lash out, Jesus lays down his life and forgives his enemies. The King of the Universe makes no claim on territory or seats of grandeur. His throne is truth, and his realm, justice. Take time to honor him.

Monday, Nov 25, 2019

MEMORIAL OF CATHERINE OF ALEXANDRIA, VIRGIN, MARTYR

A saint for the ages

Daniel 1:1-6, 8-20; Luke 21:1-4

"She, from her poverty, has offered her whole livelihood."

Just as November begins with the feast of All Saints, it ends with examples of how the church remembers saints such as Catherine of Alexandria (c. 287-305). Iconography reminds us that she was of Egyptian royalty (often shown with a crown), and she could have used her privilege to do almost anything. She chose to immerse herself in the study of philosophy—she's often shown with books. Other symbols remind us of her fate once she was baptized at 14 and rebuked the Roman emperor for persecuting Christians. Catherine is typically depicted with a spiked wheel—a torture device said to have miraculously broken apart as the emperor first tried to execute her—along with the "palm of martyrdom" and the sword that finally beheaded her. We're all called to be saints. What symbols would adorn your holy card?

Tuesday, Nov 26, 2019

Test the message

Daniel 2:31-45; Luke 21:5-11

"See that you not be deceived... Do not follow them!"

Jesus warned against false prophets promising salvation to those who heed their call, yet each age seems to produce its own crop of misguided messiahs. In our own time, many will remember the tragedies associated with delusional figures such as Charles Manson, David Koresh, Yahweh ben Yahweh, and Jim Jones. Be cautious with those who promise much but demand unquestioning loyalty in return. If the fruits of humility, compassion, respect, and integrity are not visible in the message, don't trust the messenger.

Wednesday, Nov 27, 2019

I had a dream

Daniel 5:1-6, 13-14, 16-17, 23-28; Luke 21:12-19

"I have heard that you can interpret dreams and solve difficulties."

You might wonder if God still speaks to us, as in biblical times, through our dreams. The church teaches that while we already have received the fullness of "public revelation," God can still offer us "private revelation"—guidance on our life journey or major decisions—through our dreams. But such revelations are not common—most dreams are randomly generated as part of sleep—and dreams with a message require skillful interpretation by way of prayer and reflection, and ideally with the assistance of a spiritual advisor. Pay attention to your dreams, but also test them.

Thursday, Nov 28, 2019

THANKSGIVING DAY

Deepen your gratitude

Daniel 6:12-28; Luke 21:20-28

"Stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Research from the Greater Good Science Center at University of California, Berkeley and A Network for Grateful Living has underscored the importance of gratitude—or "reverence for what is given." Focusing our mental lens on abundance, not scarcity, can lead to dramatic improvements in health and quality of life. Dr. Robert Emmons and Brother David Steindl-Rast pioneered the field that teaches us to appreciate *all* experiences, whether we once labeled them "good" or "bad." Find a gratitude practice for you or your family at gratefulness.org. Try it for a week.

Friday, Nov 29, 2019

God's persistent presence

Daniel 7:2-14; Luke 21:29-33

"Know that the kingdom of God is near."

Both of today's readings point toward the notion that God's kingdom persists, no matter what. Daniel presents fantastical, destructive beasts with teeth and horns and thrones of flames. But vanquishing them all is "one like a son of man" with an enduring kingship. In the gospel, Jesus reinforces the idea: the kingdom is near; his words will endure. There is comfort here for the faithful: While the world around us may be in upheaval, God's presence never fails. Allow yourself today to rest in the certainty that God's kingdom is always at hand.

Saturday, Nov 30, 2019

FEAST OF ANDREW, APOSTLE

Introducing Jesus

Romans 10:9-18; Matthew 4:18-22

"They left their nets and followed him."

If ever there were a patron saint of introductions—fortuitous, lifechanging introductions—it would have to be Andrew. At the beginning of John's gospel, Andrew tells his brother Simon Peter, "We have found the Messiah," before introducing him to Jesus. And we all know how that turned out for Peter! Later, before Jesus performs the miracle that fed 5,000 people, it was Andrew who introduced him to the boy with two fish and five loaves. Later still, it was Andrew who was approached—on the eve of Jesus' death—when a few curious Gentiles wanted to meet Jesus. As Advent begins, consider ways that you, too, could introduce others to Christ. Like the boy with the loaves and fishes, it could be as simple as bringing food to a gathering.
