

Notes from the Pastor

INTRODUCTORY RITE DURING LENT: We will be doing something slightly different during Lent at the beginning of Mass! We will begin by kneeling (if you can't kneel, please sit) and singing the opening song. The priest, deacon, and altar server will process in to the opening song and then kneel as well. We will do the greeting, the penitential rite and the opening prayer all while we are kneeling. After the opening prayer we will be seated for the First Reading. It is just a simple way to remind ourselves that we are beginning a special season in our Church year.

FISH DINNERS: I had my introduction to your Fish Dinners last week. I was only able to stay for part of the dinner at St. Thomas, but it seemed like there were plenty of volunteers and things were going smoothly. The dinner at St. Teresa also had plenty of volunteers and things were going very well. I was impressed by the organization of the dinners and the way people jumped in to help when someone wasn't able to make it. People don't always realize how much work goes into these dinners and the generosity of those who plan them and those who work them. If you have never been a part of one of these dinners, there is always room for a few more volunteers. It is always a great way to meet new people and to build community.

<u>CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL (CSA)</u>: So far in our Catholic Services Appeal we have 52 pledges for \$21,820 towards our goal of \$24,359 at St. Teresa, and 60 pledges for \$32,225 towards our goal of \$37,254 at St. Thomas.

We have included two projects for each parish in addition to the diocesan assessments. These are lofty goals, but we are aiming high to address some important issues at each parish. At St. Teresa we hope to collect enough over our assessment amount to pay back our loan of \$30,000 to the diocese for the reconfigured roof on the Parish Center and in addition to that we are hoping to raise enough to pave the section of the parking lot between the church and the garage (\$35,000). At. St. Thomas, we are hoping to collect enough to upgrade the electrical wiring to the lights in the church and then start a fund for the future paving of the parking lot (\$85,000).

In the past we have had a generous response from a good number of parishioners. <u>I am asking that every family make a pledge or a gift to this Appeal</u>. This Appeal benefits everyone in the parish and we should all be making some effort to achieve the goals that benefit everyone. Pledge envelopes are in the pews today and at the exits. Please take an envelope and consider your pledge or gift in the coming week.

UPCOMING ADULT CLASSES: As part of the Eucharistic Revival, I am offering a class at each parish. The content will be the same, so you are welcome to go to either class. The first class had 28 people signed up. The second class will be Monday, March 11, from 6:30pm to 7:30pm at St. Teresa Parish Center. Signups for the second class are on the sheets at the exits of the church.

is offered this time. The evening will begin at 6:30pm and end at 7:30pm. Meeting dates are Monday, March 4 at St. Elizabeth Parish Center and Tuesday, March 5 at St. Teresa Parish Center. You will be invited to discuss two questions.

- The diocese of Erie identified these four major themes in the participatory phase of the synod: welcome and inclusivity, communication, leadership, and mission/outreach. Do these resonate with you? Since then, what successes and distresses have you experienced around these themes?
- How does or how could the Church walk alongside you in the major concerns or needs in your life?

Pope Francis is looking for your input on these issues in preparation for the Worldwide Synod in Rome. Your answers to these questions will become part of a series of discussions that will eventually reach the Synod in Rome in October 2024.
