Notes from the Pastor

PASTORAL PLANNING IN OUR DIOCESE: The process of Pastoral Planning is an ongoing process in our diocese. This was started back in 2017 with a number of significant mergers and partnerships of parishes. After that initial round of consolidation, the diocese began to look at various areas in the diocese where even more planning and consolidating needed to be done. The Bradford and Clearfield areas are reaching the final stage in their planning that includes some immediate consolidation as well as plans for more restructuring three to five years down the road.

The Erie area is the next focal point for the diocese. Some introductory plans were laid out months ago, and the bishop has since released two letters concerning this restructuring of parishes. A preliminary plan for the Erie area is set to be released later this month. Our parish finance and parish councils will be invited to those meetings. After that meeting parishes will have thirty days to respond to the preliminary plan – either accepting it or proposing alternate solutions.

This is a very serious process and will affect all of us in some way. The most helpful way that you can participate in this process is to offer insightful and positive suggestions to the preliminary plan. In the Bradford and Clearfield areas the insightful suggestions of some people have changed the plan for the better.

In preparation for this process, I ask everyone to read the letters the bishop has produced on Pastoral Planning. The first was entitled, "Building the Future" is an eight-page document that outlines what has been done and some of the reasons behind the need for this restructuring of our diocese. The second letter was read a few weeks ago at all the Masses. Both letters and much more can be found at the Pastoral Planning Microsite on the Diocesan webpage, www.eriercd.org

Pastoral Planning Prayer


Loving God, author of creation,
