

Notes from the Pastor

PRAYER: October is one of those months where we focus our attention on the Rosary as one form of prayer. I thought it might be good to do some columns on prayer during this month. Everyone is different in how they pray and what kind of prayer works for them. Hopefully, our prayer is leading us deeper into the ultimate prayer, the Eucharist, and into a deeper relationship with God. Hopefully, my reflections will be of some assistance to us as we make that journey into deeper relationship with God.

There are many different perspectives on prayer. Prayer can be private, like our personal prayer, or it can be public like our celebration of the Eucharist. Prayer can repeat the words of others, or what we might call formal prayer, or prayer can be spontaneous, using our own words. There are also forms of prayer that meditate on the Scriptures, some forms of prayer that engage us in contemplation and silence, and the list can go on to be quite lengthy. Sometimes people are looking for a new form of prayer as their form is becoming stale or routine, and maybe one of these other forms can be helpful in those times.

Let me focus today on the traditional forms of prayer in our Catholic Tradition that are summarized by the acronym, ACTS: Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving, and Supplication (Intercession).

Adoration is the kind of prayer where we give homage to God by remembering that God is goodness itself, and that God is always present to us and loving us. This type of prayer recognizes that God is the creator, and we are the creatures. We recognize the ways in which God is so far beyond us and yet so very near to us.

Contrition is the kind of prayer where we place ourselves humbly before God and recognize that at times our actions are not what God would hope for us. We recognize that at times we sin and need to ask God for forgiveness. We might do this in a daily examination of conscience and an act of contrition. We might do this also in the sacrament of Reconciliation (Penance or Confession as it is sometimes called).

Thanksgiving prayer is where we take time to acknowledge the many ways in which God has blessed us in the people we encounter in life, the gifts we have been given, and the blessings that come our way each day. One practice of this, that is difficult at first but becomes easier as you do it more and more, is to pause at the end of each day and call to mind 10 things you need to be thankful for from the day. As I said, it can be difficult at first to come up with 10, but as you practice this prayer, 10 becomes easy and you approach 20 or more. It is a great way to focus on the positive things in your life when there is so much negativity we are surrounded by.

Supplication, or Intercessory Prayer, is where we ask God for the things we need and more importantly, where we ask for things for other people. This is where we pray for those who are ill, those who are grieving, someone struggling with a problem, for an end to war and violence, or for peace in the world. This is the type of prayer that moves us beyond just asking for things for ourselves and include the needs of others. This helps to form a compassionate heart within us.

"Question of the Week" - 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Question for Children: What makes you feel peaceful inside? What makes you feel restless?

Question for Youth: How do you thank God for the talents that you have? How do you give back to God through the use of your talent?

Question for Adults: What steps do you take each week to make sure you are doing as Paul directs: "Live according to what you have learned and accepted."?

All these prayers we find in our greatest prayer, the Eucharist. At the beginning of each Mass, we call to mind our sins and humble ourselves in the presence of God. We call to mind the great mercy that God extends to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus that we celebrate in this Eucharist. We give praise to God in our singing of the Gloria and in the Eucharistic prayer. After the creed we pray the Universal Prayers or our Petitions (Intercessions) for all those in need. Our reception of Communion and our thanksgiving afterwards are moments when we acknowledge the saving power of God that we receive in the person of Jesus and thus in the Eucharist. Hopefully, we can recognize these forms of prayer and utilize them to enhance our Eucharistic Prayer.


