

Notes from the Pastor

PRECIOUS BLOOD AT MASS: We have reinstituted the opportunity to receive the precious blood of Christ at Sunday Masses. Please remember that we receive the fullness of Christ's presence: body, blood, soul, and divinity in the consecrated bread OR the consecrated wine. Receiving both the consecrated bread and consecrated wine is the ideal way to remember what Jesus did at the Last Supper and asks us to do each week in our celebration of the Eucharist. BUT, there are some people who may not be able to receive the host because of celiac's disease or other health issues, and others who may not be able to receive, or choose not to receive, the wine for health reasons. Thus, receiving only the consecrated bread OR the consecrated wine is truly receiving the Body and Blood of Christ.

<u>INTINCTION IS NOT PERMITTED</u>: As Catholics we are never permitted to dip the host into the wine. Jesus asked us to eat this bread and drink this cup. And so, we eat the bread and drink from the cup.

<u>ADVENT PENANCE SERVICES</u>: We will be celebrating a Communal Penance Service for Advent on Sunday, December 10, at 3:00pm at St. Thomas in Corry. (the Lenten Penance Service will be at St. Teresa). There will be five priests available to hear confessions.

Remember that the purpose of the COMMUNAL Penance celebration is to come together in prayer recognizing that we are all sinners, to spend a few moments listening to a scripture reading, an examination of conscience, praying our act of contrition together, and then confessing our sins to the priest and receiving absolution and a penance. It allows for a large number of people to celebrate the sacrament in a short period of time.

Human Celebrations - Spiritual Celebrations

SECOND WEEK OF ADVENT: WE COMMUNICATE SOMETHING TO THOSE GATHERED IN A VARIETY OF DIFFERENT WAYS

When we gather people together we share with them what is going on in our lives, what is new, what we are struggling with, and where our lives are going. In this Advent season we listen to the stories of Jesus' birth and we hear the main characters speak of their experiences of God. In these experiences we find a common message God wants us to hear: "Do not be afraid." In a year where we have been overwhelmed by fear this message is all the more important for us to hear and take to heart.

- 1. <u>Mary</u> receives a visit from the angel Gabriel which causes Mary to be "greatly troubled" at this encounter. And Gabriel immediately responds to her fear by saying, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." That simple line invites us to ponder three things: the invitation to calm her fear, the angel says her name, "Mary," which forms a bond of familiarity with her, comforts her, and that the angel says, "you have found favor with God." Once the angel has calmed her fear, the angel gives Mary her mission to conceive and give birth to the Son of God.
- 2. <u>Joseph</u> also has an experience of an angel when he finds out that Mary is with child. The angel's greeting is very similar to Mary's: "Joseph, Son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her." The angel calls Joseph by name, tries to calm his fear with an explanation of the origins of the child, and gives Joseph a mission to take Mary as his wife.
- 3. <u>Shepherds</u> also experience a frightening visit from an angel. Again, the angel speaks words of comfort to the frightened shepherds: "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." Shepherds were poor, outcasts, and they even smelled like the sheep. And yet the angel appears to them with a word of comfort for their fear and a mission to go see this sign of the newborn Messiah.
- 4. <u>John the Baptist</u> is one of the central figures of our Advent season. He doesn't have an experience of an angel, that we know of, but Luke tells us that the "Word of God came to him." John preached a message of repentance which invited people to be baptized for the forgiveness of their sins. Those who came humbly acknowledging their sins were baptized. John is somewhat harsh with those who do not seem to be sincere in their asking for forgiveness. He is known for saying, "I baptize you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire." John invites people to prepare for the coming of the Messiah by having their sins forgiven through baptism. John proclaims a God who forgives and not a God to be feared. We may feel unworthy at times but John invites us to trust in the forgiveness that God offers to heal our sin.

I would like to suggest that we try to find time to pray with these stories of Mary, Joseph, the Shepherds, and John the Baptist. Find 15 minutes each day to spend in silence, or quiet prayer, alone time, even walking in silence. This is not a time for us to be doing the talking, but to be doing the **listening**. As you reflect on these stories, listen for God to call you by name, to calm the fears that you are having, and to hear the mission that God is calling you to undertake at this time in your life. Once we overcome our fears, it is then that God can give us our mission and do great things in our lives.
