

#### Notes from the Pastor

SPRINKLING WITH HOLY WATER: We will be using a sprinkling rite at the beginning of Mass during the Easter season. When I sprinkled people on Easter, I was surprised that many people did not know what to do when they were sprinkled with holy water. The proper response to being blessed with holy water is to make the sign of the cross. The only time we genuflect is to the blessed sacrament in the tabernacle or the monstrance.

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL (CSA): So far in our Catholic Services Appeal we have 90 pledges for \$34,950 towards our parish goal of \$54,000 at St. Teresa, and 110 pledges for \$53,235 towards our goal of \$50,000 at St. Thomas.

I am grateful to all those who have participated in this appeal. In the coming weeks we will be making a second appeal to those who have not yet given. Since we have already surpassed our diocesan goals, all the money collected after this will go towards our parish projects. With the help of everyone, we can make those projects a reality.

Just a reminder of those projects. Our parish assessments for the CSA are St. Teresa: \$24,359 and St. Thomas \$37,254. We have included two projects for each parish in addition to the diocesan assessments. These are lofty goals, but we are aiming high to address some important issues at each parish. At St. Teresa we hope to collect enough over our assessment amount to pay back our loan of \$30,000 to the diocese for the reconfigured roof on the Parish Center and in addition to that we are hoping to raise enough to pave the section of the parking lot between the church and the garage (\$35,000). At. St. Thomas, we are hoping to collect enough to upgrade the electrical wiring to the lights in the church and then start a fund for the future paving of the parking lot (\$85,000).

FIRST FRIDAY COMMUNION CALLS: I want to thank those who have taken advantage of this opportunity for me to visit those who are shut into their homes or seriously ill. I am also surprised that some of the people who told me they needed or wanted this have not called the parish office (814-663-3041) to make arrangements for this. I encourage you to call the parish office to alert us to people who are shut-in to their homes on hospice, or in nursing homes, so that we can organize what we have long called, "First Friday Calls" in the Catholic church. Every first Friday of the Month, the priests, deacons, and Eucharistic Ministers take communion to those who are shut-in to their homes or in nursing homes. Other Eucharistic Ministers may take communion to them more frequently, but First Friday is a time where we make a dedicated effort to reach out to those who are shut-ins and for the priest to celebrate the sacrament of the anointing of the sick.

<u>GREETING/SHAKING HANDS</u>: I am grateful to all those who have been understanding of my situation and not shaking hands with me before and after Mass. I know at times, I forget. For those of you who were not here when I announced this earlier.
