

Moving Back to the Partnered Parish Office





Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Solemnity of Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles

This Thursday, June 29, we commemorate Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles, who were martyred around the year 64 AD. Though they differed in their methodology, they never lost sight of the goal to preach Christ who was crucified, rose from the dead and

lives with us still. They have been remembered on this day since the third century. Peter was crucified upside down because he felt unworthy to die in the same way as Christ. Paul was slain by beheading, because as a Roman citizen he was not allowed to be subjected to the indignity of crucifixion.
