Notes from the Pastor

REQUIREMENTS TO BE A SPONSOR OR A GODPARENT: Probably one of the most misunderstood realities in the church is what it means to be a member of a church and how one attains a form to be a sponsor for confirmation or a godparent for baptism. If you are asked to be a sponsor or a godparent, you will need a letter, or a form, from the parish where you belong (where you are a member) that states you fulfill the requirements to be a sponsor or a godparent. Let me explore those two realities: the requirements for being a sponsor or a godparent and what it means to be a registered member.

The requirements to be a sponsor or a godparent include all of these:

- 1. You are a registered member of a parish;
- 2. You have received Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation, in the Roman Catholic Church;
- 3. You practice your faith by attending mass each weekend;
- 4. If you are married , your marriage is recognized by the Church (either you were married in the Roman Catholic church or you were given permission to have your marriage outside of the church).

What does it mean to be a registered member of a parish church? All adult Catholics are required to be registered as members of a parish church. If you are no longer being claimed as a dependent by your parents, then you are considered an adult and need to register for membership in a parish. Those who are still being claimed as dependents are considered members under their parents' membership.

Sometimes people think that because they received their sacraments at St. Thomas or St. Teresa that they are members of that parish. Sacraments are received as a right or privilege that you have because you are a member of a parish. Sacraments do not make you a member. Membership is determined by registration: filling out a physical form, receiving envelopes and contributing to the parish by time, talent, and/or treasure. If you live in Arizona, you need to register in the parish where you go to church in Arizona. The church where you attend Mass on Sunday is the parish where you should be registered at. Again, because you received your sacraments at St. Thomas or St. Teresa does not automatically make you a member of St. Thomas or St. Teresa. If you live in Arizona it would be difficult for you to attend Mass here each week and thus claim to be a member of St. Thomas or St. Teresa. It is also important for young adults who are no longer living with their parents, and no longer being claimed as dependents by their parents, to register on their own. Sacraments can be received at any Catholic church, but you register in the church where you attend Mass on Sunday. Your sponsor certificate comes from the church where you attend Mass on Sunday, not from the church where you received your sacraments. The very heart of being a sponsor or godparent is that you are practicing your faith by attending Mass each week.



Fundraising Campaign Sponsored by Knights of Columbus



Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Program

Active Aging Inc., the Area Agency on Aging for Crawford County, is distributing five \$10.00 vouchers to each eligible senior for the purchase of Pennsylvania grown fruits and vegetables, at the Canadohta Senior Center located in the Bloomfield Township building. Distribution dates this month will be on Friday, August 18, and Friday, August 25 from Noon to 1:00PM. Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Requirements for working with children: Working alongside the Bishop, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth reinforces the ongoing implementation of policies and procedures that protect children. All clergy, employees, and volunteers in the Diocese of Erie who work with children must undergo criminal record checks. The diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children and Youth screening guidelines and abuse prevention training programs emphasize the importance of knowing the employees and volunteers who have access to children in our schools and parishes. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children.
