

Notes from the Pastor

PRAYER: (Allow me to continue to reflect on prayer this week and in the weeks to follow)

There are many different ways of using the Bible in Christian prayer. Scriptural prayer does not follow a "one-size-fits-all" model. Some methods may be easier or more beneficial for certain people, while other methods might be more appealing or better for other people. Some methods are more active (concentrating on the events and/or the words of the text), while others are more receptive (letting God speak to you). Some methods are more vocal (speaking words or singing music), while others more interior (reflecting silently). Some methods are more rational (thinking with your mind), while others are more creative (using your imagination).

What Is Prayer? - Prayer is basically RELATIONSHIP and COMMUNICATION with God:

The English word "prayer" in Latin might translate as "request, entreaty, prayer." But it should be much more than just saying "gimme, gimme"! Many related biblical words: pray, ask, beg, thank, praise, bless, adore, sing hymns, etc. Consider a close human relationship (with a spouse or best friend): We not only speak with one another, but also listen to each other (one mouth, two ears!). We not only communicate verbally, but also spend time together in many other ways. We focus not just on ourselves, our needs & desires, but even more on the other person.

Types of Prayer:

Speaking to God: Verbal Prayer (A.C.T.S.+I.)

<u>Adoration</u> – Give praise and glory to God for all His love and wondrous works (Ps 148-150)

<u>Contrition</u> – With a penitent heart, ask God to forgive all your sins and failings (Ps 51, 123)

<u>Thanksgiving</u> – Give thanks to God for all gifts and blessings you have received (Ps 100, 136)

<u>Supplication</u> – Petition God for whatever you need, big or small, in humility and trust (Ps 5, 17)

Intercession – Pray also for others, for their physical, material, and spiritual needs (Ps 1, 122)

(Another popular mnemonic for the first four is P.P.P.T. = Praise, Penance, Petition, Thanksgiving)

Listening to God: Non-Verbal or Not-only-Verbal Prayer

<u>Natural World</u> – God's goodness & love are revealed to us in the beauty and marvels of nature.

<u>Human Life</u> – God can speak to us through art, music, literature, and everyday conversations.

<u>Sacred Scripture</u> – God's Word teaches and inspires us, comforts and challenges us each day.

<u>Interior Silence</u> – God can also encounter us in the stillness of our hearts, with wordless love.

<u>Terminology for Prayer</u>: (caution: precise meanings vary from one spiritual tradition to another)

Individual (private) & Communal (small-group) Prayer: Vocal Prayer (oratio)

<u>Formal or formula prayers</u>: Lord's Prayer, Hail Mary, Glory Be, Rosary, Novenas, etc.

<u>Spontaneous prayer</u>: speaking freely to God, as to a close friend <u>Intercessory prayer</u>: praying on behalf of others, or asking the saints to pray for us

Mental Prayer (meditatio)

<u>Reading</u>: Bible or other spiritual writings <u>Meditating</u>: reflecting on the meaning of texts <u>Imagining</u>: putting yourself "into the scene"

Contemplative Prayer (contemplatio)

<u>"Centering Prayer"</u>: repeating words or phrases (like a mantra); e.g. Abba, Jesus, God is Love; or the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner"

A.k.a. mystical prayer; spiritual awareness; wordless adoration; prayer of the heart; etc.

<u>Liturgical</u> (official, public) Prayer:

Eucharist / Mass: the "source & summit" of Christian life

Other Sacraments & Rites & Blessings

Liturgy of the Hours / "Divine Office"

"Spiritual Exercises" of St. Ignatius Loyola

"...by this name of Spiritual Exercises is meant every way of examining one's conscience, of meditating, of contemplating, of praying vocally and mentally, and of performing other spiritual actions, as will be said later. For as strolling, walking and running are bodily exercises, so every way of preparing and disposing the soul to rid itself of all the disordered tendencies, and, after it is rid, to seek and find the Divine Will as to the management of one's life for the salvation of the soul, is called a Spiritual Exercise." (Spir. Ex. #1).





A Letter from our Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 22, World Mission Sunday is observed throughout the Church. World Mission Sunday reminds us each year to focus on the essential work of

evangelization that is still ongoing throughout the world. Taking up this year's theme, "Hearts on fire, feet on the move" Pope Francis invites us to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts and to actively share our faith.

The World Mission Sunday collection assists the Holy Father to build up the Church in over 1,100 dioceses and territories that are too young and/or too poor to sustain themselves. Offerings support the formation of seminarians and religious men and women, assist in the construction of schools and orphanages and enable missionaries to build churches in remote and resource-limited areas.

For many years dioceses in the United States benefitted from this collection while we were still mission territory. In fact, the Diocese of Fairbanks, Alaska, received its final support as a mission diocese just last year. The annual Mission collection helps missionary dioceses until they can stand on their own feet and become independent.

As our nation has benefitted from this support in the past, may we now support those areas of the world where the Catholic faith is blossoming. I invite you to please pray for the work of the missions, and support this work as generously as you can.


