Notes from the Pastor

REVERSE RAFFLE: I want to offer my personal thanks to Kim and Larry Yaple for the wonderful job they did in organizing and running the Reverse Raffle at St. Teresa last week. It was an incredible meal and a great opportunity for people to have fun and enjoy each other's presence. Thanks to all those who helped with set up, clean up, decorating, selling tickets, working in the kitchen, and all the organization and behind-the-scenes work that made it an extremely successful and fun event.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS: I failed to offer my thanks to the Knights of Columbus and men of the parish for their work in helping Lois Woodcock with the cleaning up of the parish grounds at St. Thomas. The use of your heavy equipment and muscle helped to clean up a number of things around the church and made the exit from the parking lot much safer.

<u>SPRINKLING WITH HOLY WATER</u>: We will be using a sprinkling rite at the beginning of Mass during the Easter season. I am surprised that many people did not know what to do when they were sprinkled with holy water. The proper response to being blessed with holy water is to make the sign of the cross. Genuflecting or bowing are not the appropriate gestures.

FIRST FRIDAY COMMUNION CALLS: I want to thank those who have taken advantage of this opportunity for me to visit those who are shut into their homes or seriously ill. I am also surprised that some of the people who told me they needed or wanted this have not called the parish office (814-663-3041) to make arrangements for this. I encourage you to call the parish office to alert us to people who are shut-in to their homes on hospice, or in nursing homes, so that we can organize what we have long called, "First Friday Calls" in the Catholic church. Every first Friday of the Month, the priests, deacons, and Eucharistic Ministers take communion to those who are shut-in to their homes or in nursing homes. Other Eucharistic Ministers may take communion to them more frequently, but First Friday is a time where we make a dedicated effort to reach out to those who are shut-ins and for the priest to celebrate the sacrament of the anointing of the sick.

GREETING/SHAKING HANDS: I am grateful to all those who have been understanding of my situation and not shaking hands with me before and after Mass. I know at times, I forget. For those of you who were not here when I announced this earlier this year, I am immune suppressed and thus do not shake hands with everyone before or after Mass, particularly in cold and flu season. This is for my protection, and for yours. I will still be there to greet you, but I ask that we refrain from shaking hands.
