Notes from the Pastor

HOLY WEEK SERVICES: A huge thank you goes out to our liturgy committee for planning such a prayerful holy week. Their efforts were supported by the tremendous work of our musicians and choir members, our liturgical ministers (lectors, ushers, eucharistic ministers, altar servers, confirmation students, deacon), those who volunteered to set up and take down after each service, and our parish staff who helped to coordinate the various aspects of this week. As with everything we do here, there is a lot of behind-the-scenes work that most people do not know about. I offer my sincere thanks to everyone who played a part in making this week such a great one!

SPRINKLING WITH HOLY WATER: We will be using a sprinkling rite at the beginning of Mass during the Easter season. When I sprinkled people on Easter, I was surprised that many people did not know what to do when they were sprinkled with holy water. The proper response to being blessed with holy water is to make the sign of the cross. The only time we genuflect is to the blessed sacrament in the tabernacle or the monstrance.

<u>CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL (CSA)</u>: So far in our Catholic Services Appeal we have 89 pledges for \$34,450 towards our parish goal of \$54,000 at St. Teresa, and 109 pledges for \$52,030 towards our goal of \$50,000 at St. Thomas.

I am grateful to all those who have participated in this appeal. In the coming weeks we will be making a second appeal to those who have not yet given. Since we have already surpassed our diocesan goals, all the money collected after this will go towards our parish projects. With the help of everyone, we can make those projects a reality.

Just a reminder of those projects. Our parish assessments for the CSA are St. Teresa: \$24,359 and St. Thomas \$37,254. We have included two projects for each parish in addition to the diocesan assessments. These are lofty goals, but we are aiming high to address some important issues at each parish. At St. Teresa we hope to collect enough over our assessment amount to pay back our loan of \$30,000 to the diocese for the reconfigured roof on the Parish Center and in addition to that we are hoping to raise enough to pave the section of the parking lot between the church and the garage (\$35,000). At. St. Thomas, we are hoping to collect enough to upgrade the electrical wiring to the lights in the church and then start a fund for the future paving of the parking lot (\$85,000).

The Origins of the Feast of Divine Mercy

In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world. Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come."

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

Child Abuse Prevention Month—Reporting Child Abuse: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Physical and sexual abuse of minors are pervasive societal problems, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2022 Pennsylvania statewide report there were 4,992 substantiated reports of child abuse and 440 more cases in the court system. 2,056 or 38.2% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,501 were physical abuse. 62.2% of the victims were female. Parents remain the persons most responsible for abuse of their children. *To report child abuse, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7).
