BAPTISM By appointment. Parents must attend prebaptismal instruction.


MARRIAGE Arrangements must be made six months in advance.

Change something

Why are we so complacent, even indifferent, about our own lives?

Many years ago, I heard a powerful story from a friend in Australia. The story had an immediate impact on me, but it took on bold new meaning during this time in my life.

Clare grew up in Australia before moving to the United States and getting married. Each year she saved every penny she could to go home to Australia for a month with her son. During that month, she would visit her relatives; she especially looked forward to spending time with her brother John.

John loves his sister and would do anything for her. But year after year, the sister who returned was different from the year before...and very different from the sister he remembered growing up with. After several years John decided he needed to do something or say something but he didn't know what. On the last day of Clare's visit that year, he invited her to take a drive with him. They drove around for a while talking about lots of things, and then John pulled the car over to the side of the road.

Turning to his sister, he told her how much he loved her, that he wanted her to be happy, and he shared how he was growing more concerned each year with how her life was unfolding. Clare's eyes began to fill with tears, "You just don't seem happy, sis!" he said. "You are less and less of a person each year." Clare just sat there as a single tear escaped her left eye, ran down her cheek, and splashed on her thigh just below the line of her summer dress.

You deserve to be happy, sis!" John continued and Clare nodded knowingly. "I don't know what to do or say. I just wish I could help you, but I think this is something you have to do for yourself."

Clare finally spoke saying, "I just feel stuck, lost, angry.."

"I know you do," John empathized with her. "Just promise me you'll do something different this year. I know Mom and Dad and your friends all have their opinions about what you should do, but I am not going to get into that. Only you can decide what it's going to be. Just change something. I'm not going to tell you what you should change. Just promise me you will change something. Take some time to think about what you need to do and then, just flip that switch. Promise me."

Clare nodded and cried some more, and now John began to cry too. But the conversation itself had already flipped a switch for Clare. She knew what she needed to do, and a very different Clare returned to Australia the following year.

Now it is your turn, and mine. Promise me you will change something. There is no need to be rash or impulsive, but promise me when you work out what it is you will flip that switch. This is a new springtime in your life. It's time for a new path. Have the courage to make the change flip the switch, and you will look back a year from now with awe and amazement.

Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from...the anxieties of daily life. (Luke 21:34)

Jesus' warning about anxiety is one of the best pieces of advice we could receive right now. We have all heard the statistic that people are more likely to feel worried or depressed during the month of December than at any other time of the year. The "anxieties of daily life" seem amplified as the holidays approach, and all the emphasis on parties and family gatherings can make some people feel more stressed or isolated. It's not surprising to find our hearts feeling a little "drowsy" as we begin the season of Advent (Luke 21:34).

But advent isn't meant to be a season of anxiety. It's meant to be a season of expectation and hope. The Lord is near! He is coming to establish His kingdom! For all the warnings Jesus gives in today's Gospel, and for all the dark and foreboding images of the end that He portrays, His promise outweighs them all: "Your redemption is at hand" (Luke 21:28).

So Jesus warns us to guard our hearts so that we can experience our "redemption" more deeply this Advent. He warns us not to let anything burden us so much that it keeps us from turning to Him in prayer or talking with Him during the day. He knows that if we keep Him at a distance, for whatever reason, we run the risk of becoming spiritually drowsy—dull to His Spirit and unable to sense His presence.

There is so much that your heavenly Father want us to give you during this time of grace" inner healing, a deeper sense of peace or joy, a powerful encounter with His mercy, and wisdom and guidance for your life. If you can spend just a few minutes each day with the Mass readings and meditations, you'll be opening your heart to these gifts and more.

Don't let Advent slip away. Your redemption is at hand. Stay awake so that you can receive it!
