

Notes from the Pastor

STILL LEARNING: There are so many things about our parishes that I am still learning. I noticed that both parishes have "The Word Among Us" booklets on the tables or baskets at the entrances to the church. I just assumed everyone knew those were there for people to take and use. Those who attend daily Mass use them to follow the readings each day. Others who don't attend daily Mass use them during their prayer time each day to reflect on the readings of the day and read the meditations. So, please feel free to take a booklet and use it for your prayer each day.

<u>ADVENT PENANCE</u> <u>SERVICE</u>: We will be celebrating a Communal Penance Service for Advent on Sunday, December 10, at 3:00pm at St. Thomas in Corry. (The Lenten Penance Service will be at St. Teresa). There will be five priests available to hear confessions. People often like to go to an anonymous priest for confession rather than their pastor or someone who knows them. As priests, we jokingly call them "strange priests." Those who are scheduled to be in attendance are Frs. Suppa, Swogger, Gallina, a name from your past, Fr. Greg Passauer, and myself.

Remember that the purpose of the COMMUNAL Penance celebration is to come together in prayer recognizing that we are all sinners, to spend a few moments listening to a scripture reading, an examination of conscience, praying our Act of Contrition together, and then confessing our sins to the priest and receiving absolution and a penance. It allows for a large number of people to celebrate the sacrament in a short period of time.

#I GIVE CATHOLIC: This program is not familiar to many people and thus we are trying to put as much information out there as we can. iGiveCatholic started nationally in 2015 on the Tuesday following Thanksgiving. It is intended as a way for Catholics to reflect on the blessings they have been given and celebrated in Thanksgiving, and then to find a way to give back, and to give back specifically to some organization or parish that is Catholic.

Some of you may be familiar with other organizations, schools, and foundations that do an annual giving day to raise funds for specific projects and to support existing programs. iGiveCatholic is an online program to do just that for the Catholic Church. For those who are not computer savvy or prefer to give directly, there are envelopes in the pews to make your donation. These programs have been very successful in the secular world and the Church is using that example to benefit its programs and churches. I thank you in advance for your generosity and for all you do for our parish.

What is 'iGiveCatholic'

Both St. Thomas and St. Teresa Parishes are participating in #iGiveCatholic—it is a powerful, 24-hour online giving event to unite the faithful in dioceses across the nation (and the world!) to come together and raise as many charitable dollars as possible for Catholic parishes, schools, and nonprofit ministries on #GivingTuesday, November 28, 2023.

What is #GivingTuesday?


St. Thomas Choir for Advent & Christmas


