



#### **APRIL 24, 2022**



I hope and pray that your Easter celebrations are off to a wonderful start!!! Remember, we keep the party going for a full 8 weeks, so don't through your bunny ears out quite yet!

This weekend we are blessed to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This

wonderful devotion, propagated in an intense way by Saint John Paul the Great, is a beautiful reminder of our need to be open to the Mercy of Jesus—and let's be honest, who among us does not need to rely fully on that Mercy!!! Here is a little bit about St. Faustina and how this devotion developed:

"Sister Faustina was a young, uneducated nun in a convent of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Poland during the 1930s. She came from a poor family that struggled during the years of World War I. She had only three years of simple education, so her's were the humblest tasks in the convent, usually in the kitchen or garden. However, she received extraordinary revelations — or messages — from our Lord Jesus. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to record these experiences, which she compiled into notebooks. These notebooks are known today as the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, and the words contained within are God's loving message of Divine Mercy.

Though the Divine Mercy message is not new to the teachings of the Church, Sr. Faustina's Diary sparked a great movement, and a strong and significant focus on the mercy of Christ. Saint John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina in 2000 making her the "first saint of the new millennium." Speaking of Sr. Faustina and the importance of the message contained in her Diary, the Pope called her "the great apostle of Divine Mercy in our time."

Today, we continue to rely on St. Faustina as a constant reminder of the message to trust in Jesus' endless mercy, and to live life mercifully toward others. We also turn to her in prayer and request her intercession to our merciful Savior on our behalf.

"Saint Faustina, you told us that your mission would continue after your death and that you would not forget us. Our Lord also granted you a great privilege, telling you to "distribute graces as you will, to who you will, and when you will." Relying on this, we ask your intercession for the graces we need, especially for the intentions just mentioned. Help us, above all, to trust in Jesus as you did and thus to glorify His mercy every moment of our lives. Amen."

Deacon Randy will be leading our Parishes in praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet, this Sunday, April 24<sup>th</sup> at 3:00PM at St. Thomas Church. Please join us in prayer for all the multitude of ways we need the Mercy of Jesus in our lives. And while we are praying, let us keep our Confirmation Students: Stephen Brady, Ryah Lambert, Wesley Love, Kendra Maker, Caitlin Nordin, and Olivia Whitaker in our prayers this week as they celebrate the Sacrament with Bishop Persico at St. Francis Xavier Church in McKean. Come, Holy Spirit!!!

I will be away this week—sort of— I may have inadvertently scheduled a week away that overlapped with Confirmation, but I will be there! But I promise, I won't be in the office, so our staff can party as they had planned. Please pray for them, they need it! Enjoy the week! God help us all! *-Fr. Matt*





#### Mass Readings for the Week

Over the past five months, I have been working with our Deacons, Staff, and Members of Parish and Finance Councils of Sts. Thomas and Teresa Parishes, in order to try to reconfigure the Mass schedule at our Parishes in a way that would best suite the needs of our Parishes.

There were many factors that went into our considerations on this matter – principal among them was having your Pastor be able to be with his people in the celebration of all of our Parish Masses, and also having the Pastor and the Religious Education Director being able to be present for all of our Parish Religious Education events and classes as well. This has proved to be no easy task, but after many meetings and lots of prayer, input, reflection, and participation of many, many people, including the Diocese – we have come up with what will be **our Mass schedule for at least the next 12 months**. I say that, only because I want to make sure we are truly best serving the needs of our Parishes – and if that means that tweaks need to be made in the future, then we will make them – together.

Therefore, the following will be our new Mass schedule:

### NEW MASS SCHEDULE Effective May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2022:

Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend:

Saturday: 4:00PM at St. Thomas Church

Sunday: 8:00AM at St. Thomas Church 9:30AM at St. Teresa Church 11:00AM at Our Lady of Fatima Church

School Year/Non-Summer Schedule:

Saturday: 4:00PM – alternating monthly between Sts. Thomas and Teresa Churches

Sunday: 8:00AM – St. Thomas Church 10:00AM – St. Teresa Church

I believe this to be the equitable and just result of our months of prayer and deliberation — and is demonstrative of our need to work together as Partnered Parishes. It is my every hope and prayer that we will continue to work together, guided by the Holy Spirit, to build up God's Kingdom here in our midst at Sts. Thomas and Teresa.
