

Religious Education News:

First of all, Cheryl, Deacon Randy, and Fr. Skip want to thank all the families who took the time to fill out and return the survey that was sent out. We loved hearing about ways your families share faith! (Hopefully, we will be able to share some of these at a later time.)

- 1. There will be no Prek-k class.
- 2. <u>All classes</u> will meet in the center from 9:00 to 10:30 including Confirmation which will meet in the large conference room of the center, for social distancing.
- 3. Masks will be worn in and out of the building, and all other times, unless good reason to the contrary. Social distancing is essential, especially in those situations where masking is not possible.
- 4. First Reconciliation & First Eucharist will meet with Deacon Randy 6 weeks before the sacrament on Thursday nights.

More changes may follow and more information will be given as it becomes available.

We need more catechist for us to have face to face classes. Right now we only have 1 with the possibility of another. So here is a listing of what we need:

Grades 1-2 – 4 kids who will learn about First Reconciliation

.Grades 7-8 – Only 9 kids who are very wonderful and want to learn about their faith.

Grades 9-10 Only 6 kids who are very helpful and want to share their faith.

Confirmation Video program. Watch and discuss. 10 kids

There is little time to "think" about it... catechists have to obtain clearances for criminal and child abuse as soon as possible. This may be done on line but otherwise, takes a few weeks. Therefore, we need to know that you can help us, the better and the quicker we get all the essential paperwork in order. We are all of the opinion that know is class, I person learning is best but we need your help to make this happen!

Religious Education is scheduled to start on Sunday, September 13th. There will also be a parent meeting that day for parents grades 1-10 during that first class. The schedule will include class on Sunday, September 20^{th (2nd class)}. On September 27th the Confirmation class will host the Liturgy and there will be a meeting for Confirmation parents afterwards. There will be no class that day.
