

#### Notes from the Pastor

WEDNESDAY IS ASH WEDNESDAY AND THE BEGINNING OF LENT: Masses will be at 8:00am at St. Thomas and 7:00pm at St. Teresa, ashes will be distributed at those Masses. At 12:10pm at St. Thomas and St. Teresa there will be a short liturgy of the word service with the distribution of ashes. Ashes will only be given at those times. The insert in the bulletin today gives the details about Lenten fasting and abstinence, Stations of the Cross and Holy Week. This might be something to keep handy in your home for the Lenten season.

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL (CSA): This weekend we will kickoff our annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). If you have not already received a letter concerning this appeal at your home, one should be arriving this week. This letter explains the Appeal and includes a brochure and a pledge envelope. You may also have received the FAITH magazine which outlines in more detail the Appeal and the good work that it has and continues to do in our diocese. (If you do not receive FAITH magazine and did not receive a letter concerning this Appeal, then for some reason you are not registered in our parish. If this is the case, please contact the parish office, so we can correct this.)


Our parish assessments for the CSA are St. Teresa: \$24,359 and St. Thomas \$37,254. We have included two projects for each parish in addition to the diocesan assessments. These are lofty goals, but we are aiming high to address some important issues at each parish. At St. Teresa we hope to collect enough over our assessment amount to pay back our loan of \$30,000 to the diocese for the reconfigured roof on the Parish Center and in addition to that we are hoping to raise enough to pave the section of the parking lot between the church and the garage (\$35,000). At. St. Thomas, we are hoping to collect enough to upgrade the electrical wiring to the lights in the church and then start a fund for the future paving of the parking lot (\$85,000).

In the past we have had a generous response from a good number of parishioners. I am asking that every family make a pledge or a gift to this Appeal. This Appeal benefits everyone in the parish and we should all be making some effort to achieve the goals that benefit everyone. Pledge envelopes are in the pews today and at the exits.

<u>UPCOMING ADULT CLASSES</u>: As part of the Eucharistic Revival, I am offering a class at each parish. The content will be the same, so you are welcome to go to either class. The first class will be at St. Elizabeth Parish Center on Monday, February 12, from 6:30 to 7:30pm. You can sign up at the exits of the church to give us an idea of how many to prepare for. The second class will be Monday, March 11, from 6:30 to 7:30pm at St. Teresa Parish Center. Signups for the second class will begin after the first class is over.

There will also be two sessions preparing for the upcoming Synod in Rome. I understand that this was not offered in preparation for the most recent Synod, so I want to make sure it is offered this time. The evening will begin at 6:30pm and end at 7:30pm. You will be invited to discuss two questions.

- The diocese of Erie identified these four major themes in the participatory phase of the synod: welcome and inclusivity, communication, leadership, and mission/outreach. Do these resonate with you? Since then, what successes and distresses have you experienced around these themes?
- How does or how could the Church walk alongside you in the major concerns or needs in your life?

#### Paster's Notes (continued from inside cover):

EUCHARISTIC RENEWAL: Just a simple, yet important reminder about receiving communion. If you receive communion in the hand, you should step aside, stop, and consume the host immediately. The host should not be carried back to your seat or anywhere else. It should be consumed immediately.

In that same context, the host should be consumed before one approaches the minister to receive the precious blood. It is not permissible to dip the host in the precious blood. We eat the bread and drink from the cup.



#### **Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments**

Beware of Grooming Behavior. Children and young people can be groomed online or in the real world, by a stranger or by someone they know. This could be a family member, a friend or someone who has targeted them - like a teacher, faith leader or sports coach. Grooming is when someone builds a relationship, trust and emotional connection with a child or young person so they can manipulate, exploit, or abuse them. Grooming can take place over a short or long period of time. Some common tactics are pretending to be younger, giving advice or showing understanding, buying gifts, giving attention, taking them on trips, outings, or holidays. To prevent your child from grooming behavior, teach them about healthy relationships, how to stay safe online, and who are the trusted adults they can go to for help.
