

2nd Sunday of Lent GOSPEL MEDITATION

Psychology has taught us a great deal about family dynamics and how we have come to be the person we find ourselves to be. We are comprised of such a mixed bag of blessings and obstacles with their graced moments and sinful ones. Think back on the journey of your life and how the many different and varied choices that you made influenced the direction your life. If you didn't go on that first date with your spouse, who would be beside you today? If you chose to be in one place rather than another, what would have happened to the course your life has taken? We are on such a wonderful, exciting journey. What is most incredible and awesome is that we are not alone! God is with us. He inspires, heals, opens doors, and calls us every moment of our lives. The very life we have is due only to Him.

We can all sit down and list adjectives describing who we are. One may find him or herself more artistic than another or quicker with wit. We have unique gifts and talents and have the great gift of free will, which we treasure. Our histories come with more baggage for some and less hurdles for others, but we all have to find our way through the path we are on. However, have you ever given much thought to who you *really* are? That question has more merit than may at first appear.

We know ourselves as we live out our earthly journey. But do we know our heavenly self? What we know here is only one small part of who God has made us to be. The disciples really thought they knew Jesus until they went up the mountain. We also may think we know our true selves, too. We know that in eternal life we shall not only see God, but become like Him. Who will you be? What surprise do you think God has for you?

This is one of my favorite weekends of the whole Lenten Journey for two reasons: It is still the beginning of the Season, and the Transfiguration. Please, please, please, enter this season! There are plenty of help(s) for you. From our App, to the various books and materials, to the rice bowls, and everything in between, please use them for your benefit. If we want to be Peter, James, and John, we need to spend time with him to let him call us. We are on this journey through Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving so that we can grow and prosper how HE is calling us to be so that we can recognize him as the disciples did in this weekend's Gospel. Be not afraid.

I appreciate your attentiveness to Karen Adams who helped us all better understand how we can "live Lent" by getting involved further with Inter Church Ministries. The parish's involvement in this organization predates me. It is a great example to give alms all year round outside of Lent. Thank you for all who were able to attend Stations of the Cross and Soup Supper this past week. We need extra "soup" people to help with the Suppers. Please sign up in the Gathering Space. We also have a great opportunity this Wednesday with Stations of the Cross and Supper: **The Light is on for you**. *Many parishes in the County will be open from 5pm – 7pm on Wednesday for the Sacrament of Reconciliation*. Please come, and if you cannot join in the time here, pick a parish in the area that is open to avail yourself of the opportunity.

I was very humbled by the attendance at Ash Wednesday Mass. Thank you for taking time to be with us. We also hope you can join us for Adoration that occurs every Thursday at 8pm (except for the First Thursday of the Month). It is a great time to enter the presence of our Lord with Music and Silence. Please pray for our Confirmation Students as they are on Retreat this weekend on Sunday. Their retreat master is crazy (me), but I hope they have a good experience.

I know that many of us are getting nervous about what we are hearing about the Corona Virus and Sickness in the news. That is why this weekend throughout the Diocese, the Bishop has mandated that the shaking of hands during the "Sign of Peace" be suspended indefinitely. The Bishop, for now, has kept the option for receiving communion under the species of the Precious Blood. However, PLEASE REMEMBER TWO THINGS regarding the Precious Blood:

Receiving Holy Communion under the Precious Body (the Host), is the primary opportunity to receive our Lord in Communion. The option for the Precious Blood is exactly that, an option. For "full participation" as the Second Vatican Council reminds us, you need only to receive his Body.

If you are feeling sick (even the feeling of sniffles, etc.,) **<u>DO NOT</u> <u>PARTAKE</u>** from the Cup. If you are in doubt, please remember Point One: don't take from the Cup , and Jesus Loves you.

We will also make sure that we have a plethora of hand sanitizer around. Please use common sense, especially for the more vulnerable among us, and go to the Doctor if you are not feeling well.

In the meantime, please remember that Jesus wants to "Transfigure" us, and may we continue to pray for each other! Please pray for our Confirmation Kids and myself tomorrow/today!
